THEME OF THE WEEK: He is Risen to Give Us Believing Joy

“Happy is the one who has the God of Jacob for his help; whose hope is in the LORD his God” (Psalm 146:5). SUN

SCRIPTURE: John 16:16-23 The Joy of Resurrection

“A little while” Jesus says, and they will not see Him. He will be dead and buried. But then, “a little while,” and they will see Him. He will rise from the grave and visit His disciples. Then their joy will be complete. Then their prayers will be answered. Then they will know that their Rabbi and Teacher is their Savior and their God. Jesus’ resurrection also gives us joy. We know that sin, death, and the devil no longer own us. We are free from their tyranny. We are forgiven, and on the last day we will rise and stand with Jesus, our Savior and our God, in a life that never ends. *Dear Jesus, give us the joy of Your resurrection as we wait for our own resurrections. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 75: God’s Work of Humbling and Exalting

Psalm 75:7, “God is the judge. He puts down one, and sets another up.” Our lives are in the Lord’s hands. He exalts. He humbles. He gives, He takes away. The haughty He casts down. The rich He sends empty away. The lowly He exalts. The humble He saves. The Humble One He brought out of the grave, and exalted Him, giving Him the name above every name: Jesus Christ, Our Savior. We rejoice that our lives are in the Lord’s hands, because His hands were crucified for us. His hands bleed for our redemption. His hands hold nothing back. “God is the judge,” and by the death and resurrection of Christ, He has judged us fit for eternal life. *Unto You, O God, we give thanks, for Your name is near us with Your gifts of life. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 2:11-20: Free to Do Good

“Live as free people,” writes St. Peter, “but do not use your freedom as a cover-up for wickedness, but live as servants of God.” This is a mystery of the Christian life: we are free to live as servants. We are free from the condemnation and coercion of the law, which means we are free to love the law and begin to follow the law (loving God and our neighbor). We are set free from the fear of death, which gives us the freedom to die, to lay down our lives for our friends. The freedom that the death of Jesus wins for us is a freedom from fear, and a freedom to love, and delight in the gifts of God’s mercy. *O Jesus, set us free from fear by the preaching of Your resurrection. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Lamentations 3:18-26: New Mercies

“The LORD’s mercies are new every morning.” What does that mean? In many ways the Lord’s mercies never change. The preaching of the cross of Jesus is the same, day after day. The news of the empty tomb will be the same good news tomorrow and the next day until the last day. How, then, are God’s mercies new? They are new, every morning, for us sinners. The devil is always troubling us with our sin, tempting us with grief and guilt, as we always wonder if God’s mercy is enough to cover our latest failures. The answer? Yes! His mercy is new every morning. Our Lord Jesus shows up every day with a surprising dose of kindness and grace. His forgiveness covers all our sins, every day. *Great is Your faithfulness, O Lord, my hope is in You. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: John 14:1-11: Room in the Father’s House

Jesus says, “I go to prepare a place for you.” What a beautiful text. Jesus promises that His death, resurrection, and ascension make a place for us in the Father’s house. Now, we want to remember that the problem with the Father house is not that it wasn’t big enough, like Jesus had to go and convert the garage into a bedroom. The reason there was not a place for us in the Father house is because there is not a place there for sin, and I am a sinner. But the death of Jesus forgives our sins. His blood cleanses us from all iniquity. And now there is a place for us. Now the door is open. Now, by His death, by His forgiveness, where He is, we will be also. *Lord Jesus, thank You for preparing a place for me in the Father’s house by Your death and forgiveness. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 4:14-16: The Comfort of Jesus’ Temptations

Jesus knows what it is like to be tempted and troubled. Jesus knows what it is like to mourn and be sad. Jesus knows the feelings of loneliness and despair, of pain and loss, of sickness and death. He was tempted in every way like us. He knows. He knows your sorrow, your suffering, your agony, your despair, your fear, your trouble, your confusion, your doubt, your tears, your temptations. He knows, and still He died for You. Still He loves you. Still He forgives your sins. And still He prays for you. That’s the promise of this beautiful text, and the encouragement it gives us. Jesus knows our trouble, and He lives to carry us through it to life everlasting. *Jesus, remember me before the Father, and bring me to everlasting life. Amen.*

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 146: God and the Happy

“Happy is he that has the God of Jacob for his help” (Psalm 146:5). We hear a lot of talk about happiness: the key to happiness, the secret of happiness. I even saw a book, “The Happiness Project.” According to the Scriptures, happiness is not a mystery. If you have God as your Helper, you are happy. If you have God as your Savior, you are happy. This, of course, does not mean that Christians walk around with plastic smiles covering up the troubles of this life. But it does mean that we who trust in Christ in life and death know that death has no power over us, that there is no condemnation for our sin, and that in spite of all the troubles of this life, God our Creator and Redeemer, is also our friend. *O Lord, be our Helper. Amen.*

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
