Around the Word Devotions + the week of October 10-16, 2021

THEME OF THE WEEK: Resisting the Flesh Led by the Devil

Neither the devil nor our sinful flesh wants God's name to be hallowed or His kingdom to come. Thus some of the scribes accused Jesus of blasphemy when He forgave the sins of the paralytic. Their sinful flesh, led by the devil, would rather rob a sinner of God's mercy than give glory to Jesus, the Son of Man. But Christ would not be silenced. He has authority on earth to forgive sins, and having done so, He made the lame man rise and walk. Still today, we Christians receive absolution, that is, forgiveness, from the pastor as from God Himself. By this we walk in newness of life, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave us.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 9:1-8 Which Is Easier?

"Which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise and walk'?" It only took a word to heal the paralytic, but it took Christ's death on the cross to win forgiveness. Only for the sake of Jesus' blood can we be told, "Your sins are forgiven." Yet this Word of Absolution is true and powerful. Therefore, we are certain that by it our sins are forgiven before God in heaven. *Lord Jesus, You bore the cross for me. Grant me true repentance and faith in You alone for the forgiveness of sins. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:145-152 I Hope in Your Words

In this portion of Psalm 119, the psalmist alternates between his cries for help and the Lord's life-giving Word. This pattern may be reflected in our lives. When the devil, the world, and the flesh persecute us, we are driven to God's Word, which both motivates our prayers and provides their content. Then, having committed everything to the Lord in prayer, we are drawn back to His Word, where we are assured of His unfailing promise to always be near. *O Lord, answer me when I cry to You, and give me life according to Your unfailing promise. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 4:22-28 You Were Taught in Jesus

The unbeliever's life is one of futility and darkness, and so was ours at one time. But now we have been taught in Christ Jesus to put off the old self, and to be renewed in the spirit of our minds, and to put on the new self. This happens each day as we confess our sins, believe that they are forgiven for Jesus' sake, and walk in new life of love for God and our neighbor. *O God, grant me true repentance for my sins and faith in Jesus each day. Amen.*

WED

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 44:21-23 I Have Redeemed You

How many times had Israel sinned against God? The Bible is filled with accounts of her transgressions. But the Bible overflows all the more with God's mercy and forgiveness for Israel and for all people. We have been redeemed by the blood of Jesus, shed on the cross for the sins of the whole world. Therefore, though we have deserved only punishment, we return to God our Father, trusting in His boundless mercy toward us poor, sinful beings. *Lord Jesus, my Redeemer, You are worthy of all glory and honor for the mercy You have shown to me. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: John 1:35-51 Come and See

Sinners must be brought to Jesus, for we cannot by our own reason or strength believe in Him or come to Him. Regardless of who brought us to church the first time, it was the Holy Spirit who created saving faith in us through the Word of God. As we invite others to "come and see," we trust that God Himself will do His work of creating faith in those who hear the Gospel. *Gracious God, give me courage to bring others to hear Your Word, trusting that You alone have the power to create faith in our hearts. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 12:12-27 Have Care for One Another

In Holy Baptism we were clothed with the robe of Christ's righteousness that covered all our sin. So we also should be ready to cover the faults of our fellow Christians. "Our unpresentable parts are treated with greater modesty...that there may be no division in the body, but that the members may have the same care for one another." It is a gracious thing when we care for our fellow believers by forgiving them, even as God in Christ forgives us. *Lord Jesus, help me to forgive those who trespass against me and explain everything in the kindest way. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 61 The Shelter of His Wings

When our hearts are faint, our only refuge is the Lord God Almighty. We should be confident that He will defend us in every time of need because He was willing to be crucified for us. Jesus purchased and won us by His blood that we may be His own and live under Him in His kingdom. We dwell in safety under the shelter of His wings, serving Him in everlasting righteousness, innocence, and blessedness, ever singing praises to His Name. *Hear my cry, O God, listen to my prayer, and let me dwell in Your tent forever. Amen.*
