THEME OF THE WEEK: Resisting the Flesh Led by the Devil

Sinful flesh would have us believe that we would be better off going it alone. Such is the captivity to which fallen humanity is enslaved. We think we are the masters of our own lives - we cannot even see our slavery. Jesus has come to set you free! You are now in Him. The slavery to sin and sinful living no longer binds you. SUN

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 9:1-8 Your Sins are Forgiven!

Can Jesus forgive? The scribes were grumbling because Jesus forgave the paralyzed man. They didn't think Jesus could do such a thing - because they didn't believe that Jesus is God. They grumbled whether Jesus could forgive sins. Jesus showed His authority to forgive by healing the man. We are tempted to grumble like the scribes about whether a pastor can publicly forgive sins. Thanks be to God that Jesus has such authority, and gives that authority to His called and ordained servants. Work in us, O God, hearts that truly believe Your Words of forgiveness spoken to us. Amen.



SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:145-152 Save Me!

Crying and calling. When we were infants that was our whole life! Crying in need, calling for help. Then we grew up and left such childish ways behind us. Yet the Psalmist teaches us that calling and crying are good, right, and proper! That's faith: calling upon the Lord and crying out to Him, always desiring to receive more of God's gifts. And the Lord loves to give His gifts! He loves to answer the cries and calls of His people. "Thine forever, God of love! Hear us from Thy throne above; Thine forever may we be here and in eternity!" Amen. (LSB 687:1)

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 4:22-28 Set Free for Freedom

What you once were, you are not now. You are made new in Christ. Recreated, renewed, reborn. "Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation." (2Cor. 5:17a) Baptized into Jesus, you are bound to Him and set free from the sins which hold fallen humanity captive. Bound to Jesus, you are no longer bound to corruption or deceitful desires, falsehood, anger, theft, or laziness. You are free. Live joyfully in the freedom for which He has set you free! "Come, O Christ, and loose the chains that bind us..." Amen. (LSB 679:5)

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 44:21-23 The Glad Song of Redemption

There are so many ways to feel forgotten in our lives. Forgotten by our families. Forgotten by our peers. Forgotten by our government and leaders. God promised Israel, His people, that they would not be forgotten by Him. That promise is for you, the true Israel of God. He has remembered you - and redeemed you. Jesus has remembered all of your sin and paid for them all. Now you may rest assured that He who has remembered you and redeemed you remembers your sins no more! "Lift up one voice; [with] heaven rejoice in our Redeemer's song!" Amen. (LSB 676:3)

SCRIPTURE: John 1:35-51 Anything Good? Yes!

Can anything good come from Nazareth? Nathanael couldn't believe that it might. We're afflicted with the same unbelief gnawing at us. Unbelief insists that we don't need to hear God's Word, that it's no different than others. Can any good come from it? What's so special about the Divine Service? Can anything good come from it? Listen to your brother Philip! Come and see! Here is Jesus in the Word of God, Absolution, and Supper: for you. Truly He is the Son of God - and He is for you. "Open our ears to hear You, Lord, and to know You are good." Amen.

SCRIPTURE: John 15:17-21 Unknown to the World... Known by Jesus

Today we remember two lesser known Apostles - Saints Jude and Simon. Saint Jude, that is NOT Iscariot and Saint Simon, the one called the Zealot. (That is, NOT Simon Peter.) Both known by who they were NOT. Jesus reminded them in today's reading that they would be known as His disciples, and that meant they would be hated, rejected, and persecuted. We, too, might live unknown, obscure lives or even persecuted lives, as they did. Yet we are known by Jesus! Named as His own! "Support and sustain us, Lord God, as we bear Your name in the world!" Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 61 Led to the Rock

"Lead me to the rock that is higher than I." And so He does. He leads us to Himself, to His Son, where we have redemption, the forgiveness of sins. Because of Jesus, we may dwell in God's house forever, in safety under the shadow of His wings. Consider on this Saturday: this is the day Jesus rested from His work of salvation, so that He may lead you to His house tomorrow - and forever! He leads you to Himself, the Rock which was opened to give you life. "Let me ever sing praises to Your name, O Lord God!" Amen.
