THEME OF THE WEEK: **The Confidence in God Wrought by the Spirit**

Confidence in God does not and cannot originate in us. It is the gift of God given to us by His Spirit through His Word and Sacraments. Likewise, confidence in God is not a matter of wishful thinking or blind optimism, but rests solely on what God has done and continues to do for us in and through our Lord Jesus Christ! Through His Word of promise, the Holy Spirit continues to draw us out of trusting in ourselves and the things of this world and to place our confidence and trust in Him who alone is faithful, who alone is our refuge and strength, our light and salvation. Indeed, none who take refuge in the Lord will be put to shame or be condemned (Psalm 34:22).

SCRIPTURE: **Matthew 6:24-34 Do Not Be Anxious**

What are you anxious about? Many things cause worry and anxiety today; viruses, vaccines, mask mandates, school shutdowns, broken relationships, fractured friendships, and much more. And yet our Lord Jesus is very direct, "Do not be anxious about your life." Why? It's very simple. If our Heavenly Father cares for the birds of the air and lilies of the field, will He not also care for you who are much more valuable to Him than these? Our Lord Jesus invites us then in the midst of worry and anxiousness to trust in our Heavenly Father's steadfast love and providential care for us. It is He, after all, Who gave His one and only Son for you, that you may have life now and forever in Him. *O Lord, help me to cast all my anxieties on You. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Ps 119:113-120 Our Shelter and Shield**

Until the return of our Lord Jesus, God's people will always be surrounded by the double-minded and evildoers; those who hate God's Word, reject His laws and despise those who love His testimonies. For those who fear and love God, Yahweh alone is their shelter and shield. He will uphold and sustain His own, keeping them safe in the day of trouble. This He has promised to the psalmist and to you. This He has fulfilled in Jesus, the Word of God made flesh for you. Rejoice then and be glad, for the Lord does not lie and those who put their trust in Him will never be put to shame! *Help me, O Lord, to trust and cling to Your Words of life and promise all my days. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Galatians 5:25-6:10 Living and Walking by the Spirit - Holy Cross Day**

Saint Paul writes a little earlier in his letter to the Christians in Galatia, "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me" (Gal. 2:20-21). Like Paul, you and I were crucified and raised with Christ in the waters of Holy Baptism. He now lives in you and you in Him. Freed from the condemnation and burden of the law. We daily die and rise, live and walk by the Spirit in our baptism, loving God and our neighbor, especially our brothers and sisters in Christ. *Lord Jesus, thank You for bearing the cross for my sin that I may freely live and love in You. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Deuteronomy 6:4-7 The One True God**

There is only one true God. All others are fakes and pretenders, counterfeits and cheats, idols and devils. The one true God rescued His people from the hand of Pharaoh and Egyptian slavery. This same God has rescued us from the hand of sin and the grip of death in Christ Jesus. Only this God can give us life and everything needed to support this body and life. Though at times we foolishly think our idols can give us what we think we need, these false gods only lead us into slavery and death. The Lord our God, the only the true God, is He who gives real life, true freedom, everlasting joy, peace that surpasses all understanding, and hope and beyond all hope. *Triune God, help me always to look to You alone for forgiveness, life and salvation. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Luke 10:38-42 One Thing Is Necessary**

When we entertain house guests, we enjoy serving them the best we have to offer. Perhaps Martha enjoyed doing the same. When the Lord Himself was her house guest, I imagine she wanted to serve Him the very best she had to offer. Nothing wrong with that! However, where Martha went wrong was not letting the Lord Jesus serve her. He did not come to Mary and Martha's home to be served, but to serve them by giving and teaching them His Words of life and salvation. We make the same mistake when in our living and serving others we do not let Jesus serve us with His Word of life and His gifts of grace, mercy and forgiveness given us in the Divine Service. *Lord Jesus, help me to receive what You have to give me in Your Word; the one thing necessary. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Acts 8:26-39 The Good News of Jesus**

Dr. Luther once said, "Take Christ out of the Scriptures and what will you find in them?" Without the good news of Jesus Christ the Bible is impossible to understand. This good news, however, is at the heart and center of the Scripture's witness. It is this good news that Philip was sent to proclaim to the Ethiopian eunuch. And it is this good news of Jesus that not only illuminated the prophet's words, but also worked faith in the eunuch. As Isaiah prophesied long ago, Jesus is the Lamb of God who went willingly and silently to His slaughter for your sins and those of the whole world. Without this Jesus and His work for you, the Scriptures and life itself are meaningless. *Lord Jesus, thank You for Your good news that saves me and gives me life forever. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: **Psalms 34 The Lord Hears and Delivers**

The fear of the Lord drives out fear of anyone or anything else. Those who fear the Lord lack no good thing! That's the Lord's promise to you and me. Of course, trouble, affliction, and cross can be expected in this life for those who fear the Lord and confess His holy name. David is not naive or blind to the trials of God's people. "Many are the afflictions of the righteous," he writes. And yet, the Lord is always near those who fear Him. He never despises the cries of His saints and will deliver those who take refuge in Him. David knows this firsthand. Thus, he calls us to join him in praising our faithful God who saves and blesses His children. *O Lord, thank You for Your steadfast love and faithfulness in Christ both to me and all those who fear You. Amen.*
