THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered the Enmity of Unbelievers

The Lord promises us that in His Word we have everything we need for faith and a holy life. So we cling to His Word. We cling to it, given to us in our baptism, with His Name placed upon us. We cling to it as it delivers to us Jesus' blood. We cling to it as it gives us promises which are always fulfilled. We cling to it as we confess it before men. We cling to it as it guarantees our salvation in the Means of Grace. And we cling to it even when assaulted by evil and death. So in the end we can confess in the face of it all: "I believe that I shall look upon the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living!"

SCRIPTURE: John 8:46-59 - Sola Scriptura Leading to Life

Sola Scriptura, Scripture Alone, was one of the great rallying cries of the Reformation and is that which brings us to eternal life. "If anyone keeps my word," Jesus says, "he will never see death." That is because through the Scriptures: preached, bound to water in our baptism, connected to the bread and wine, and declared in the Absolution, we have words of eternal life. We have words which forgive sin, raise the new Adam, and bring dead men to life. So, though we die (physically) yet shall we live (eternally) because we have everlasting, life-giving words. Therefore, we cling to and hold fast to those words, as if our lives depend on it, for they do. Jesus, thank You for Your Word which raises me daily to new life, help me ever to keep it. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 54 – Looking Our Enemies in the Eye

The Christian has three chief enemies: sin, death, and the devil. They assault us from every angle and bring us all sorts of trouble throughout our days. It is easy to despair of them and give in. But they are defeated. Our Lord has delivered us from those enemies and from all their trouble through the death of Christ, which is the fullness of His might. That victory and salvation is given to us as His name is placed on us in Holy Baptism. Because of that victory, that salvation, and that vindication, we may look upon these enemies; our sin, our forthcoming death, and even the devil, and we may laugh, for in Christ, we triumph. Heavenly Father, thank You for giving me the victory over my foes through Your Son's death and resurrection. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 9:11-15 - Eternity-Securing Blood

The sacrifices of the Old Testament were a constant reminder of the sins of the people. Week after week and year after year blood was spilt to forgive the sins of the people. But it was never done. Christ, however, brings His own blood to the altar of the cross, the culmination of all the previous sacrifices, to make a final sacrifice for the sins of all people of all time. That blood purchased us, it redeemed us, from the clutches of the devil who desires our eternal damnation. Because of that blood, we have an eternal redemption, eternal salvation, and an eternal inheritance as God's beloved children. Lord Jesus Christ, I give You thanks for Your blood, poured out for me, giving me the assurance of everlasting life with You. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Genesis 12:1-3 – A Promise in the Loins

When God promises that "in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed," He is pointing Abram and us to the blessed promise of His Son, our coming Savior, Jesus. SCRIPTURE: 2 Corinthians 1:21-31 - Guaranteed in Christ

One of the greatest temptations the devil can bring upon us is to despair of our salvation. It's easy to do. All the devil has to do is point out the myriad of ways we have broken God's Law and deserved His eternal anger. But the devil always leaves out the important parts, like Jesus and His death. So, in order to fight this temptation, the Lord gives us the Spirit to guarantee our salvation. The guarantee is found in the Spirit's gifts: the Scriptures, Holy Baptism, and the Sacrament of the Altar. All those are external to us. All these gifts rely, not on us, but on God who establishes them for us, for our comfort, and for our salvation. Lord God, thank You for sending the Spirit with Your life-giving gifts so that I may have certainty and assurance. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 27 – Kept Safe So We Can See God

Evildoers, and armies, and war, oh my! And the list could go on and on. We have a great multitude of things which fight against the Lord's Christians. But the Lord promises to protect us from them, to hide us in His shelter, to conceal us, to lift us upon a rock. Therefore, we are preserved from all calamity. Nothing they can do can separate us from God in Christ. In the end, though we die, we will be raised on the last day. And so we are left with this final confession in the midst of all adversity: "I believe that I shall look upon the goodness of the Lord in the land of the living!"
