THEME OF THE WEEK: He is Risen to be the Shepherd of the Church

Shepherds need sheep and sheep need shepherds. The two go together. Our Good Shepherd is here to care for you, His sheep. You need His correction, His leading, His care, and His protection. The sheep of God are found by the Good Shepherd and put into the Church of Christ. In the church the Good Shepherd provides for His flock and feeds them on His Word and His body and blood. To leave the church is to leave the flock and to leave the care of Jesus. The flock of the church is the place where you are protected and will receive all that you need for eternal life.

SCRIPTURE: John 10:11-16 Sacrificial Shepherd

The Shepherd willingly does what needs to be done. What needs to be done is the hardest of sacrifices; to give of your own life for someone else. The Sacrificial Shepherd lays down his life by dying on the cross and takes it up again as He is raised from the dead. Jesus is charged to do this for you by His heavenly Father. As the sheep of God we receive this great sacrificial gift with thanksgiving and acknowledge that what we could not do for ourselves, Jesus does for us. Jesus keeps the law perfectly and yet still dies and conquers our death. Dear Father, we give you thanks that you sent Jesus to sacrifice Himself on our behalf. Amen.



SCRIPTURE: John 14:1-14 The Shepherd leading the way (Festival of Sts. Philip and James)

Today the church gives thanks for St. Philip and St. James. Philip says to Jesus, "Lord, show us the Father, and it is enough for us." Jesus responded and said, "Whoever has seen Me has seen the Father." Jesus shows us that the way to the Father is through Him. We might find ourselves led off into other directions but these words of Jesus draw us back to Him and we are shown the way of everlasting life. To have the Good Shepherd is to have the One who sent the Good Shepherd. Philip and James were led to the Father by the wonderful teaching and actions of Jesus. It is the same for us. Jesus, show us the Father as You reveal Yourself to us in Your Word. Amen.



SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 2:21-25 The Shepherd of your soul

Wayward sheep need to be returned to the care of their Shepherd. Jesus, by bearing our sins in His body, creates the way for us straying sheep to be brought back into the fold. Jesus is called by the Shepherd and the Bishop of your soul. All the sheep/shepherd language applies, but also the care of churchly oversight. In His stead, Jesus places an undershepherd and pastor in your life. He is accountable for your soul. Pay him the respect he is due and first and foremost hear the Word, both law and gospel, that he speaks into your ears. He will be speaking about the great Shepherd of your soul. *Dear Jesus, thank You for sending me a pastor and make him faithful to You. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Ezekiel 34:11-16 The seeking Shepherd
