Around the Word Devotions + the week of April 14-20, 2024

THEME OF THE WEEK: He is Risen to be the Shepherd of the Church

God in Christ is our Good Shepherd. He makes sure we are fed and watered. But the way He does this is chiefly through His Word. He speaks, and with this speaking, gives us the true bread from heaven and the true and living water. Through this speaking He guards us against the wolves and lions. Through this speaking He raises us from death to life. And through this speaking He brings us into life immortal. This is how our Shepherd cares for us, how He acts as our Good Shepherd.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: John 10:11-16 – A voice that raises you from the dead

Jesus speaks to us. That alone is a profound thing. Jesus, Who created all things by His word speaks to us, His creation. But the word He speaks to us has not lost any of its initial creative power. It still does the same thing it did in the beginning. It creates. Our faith, our hope, our love, all the gifts that our Lord gives to us are created and sustained through this speaking. And this same word creates life. It takes us who are dead in our trespasses and sins, and raises us to new life. It sustains us in that life. And on the last day it will raise us to the life which has no end. Because the words of the Good Shepherd are the very words of eternal life. *Good Shepherd, thank You for speaking Your eternal, life giving words to me. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 70 – Speedy Deliverance

God does not delay in bringing salvation and deliverance to us. It can seem like He does at times. It can seem like God isn't listening or that He doesn't care or (even worse) that He can't do anything about our problems. But none of this is true. God is not slow as some count slowness, but is instead, patient with us. Because He's patient and that can be misinterpreted, David teaches us to pray: "Make haste, O God, to deliver me!" Be speedy, Lord God. Come quickly! And here we learn that the Lord has, in fact, come speedily to us. He's brought us to the waters of baptism, He's given us His Word, He's absolved and fed us. And all this He has done speedily, in order to deliver and help us. *Lord, thank You for delivering and helping me. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 2:21-25 – The example of Christ

When we think about what example Jesus has left for us, we can be tempted to think that we have an example of power, or glory, or authority, or some other thing that we might enjoy. But the only time the scriptures say that we have in Christ an example is here: "because Christ also suffered, leaving you an example, that you might follow in His steps." Christ is our example when He taught us how to suffer. This is so that when (not if) we suffer, we know two things: 1) we are not alone, for we have one another and we also have Jesus Himself, Who experienced the same things; and 2) we know that we will endure and come out of that suffering, because Christ Himself did just that. *Lord, help me to bear my sufferings according to Your example. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Ezekiel 34:11-16 – God is named Jealous

Of all the names that the Lord has in the scriptures, perhaps this is the strangest, or unnerving. Jealous. Why? Because we are the bride of Christ, He the bridegroom, and any time the bride goes after other grooms, other gods, the groom becomes jealous for His beloved bride. This is why the jealousy of God shows up not only here, but immediately after the first commandment in the decalogue. God has purchased us with His holy and precious blood. We are His beloved creation and holy bride. Of course He would be jealous of us going after another bridegroom. But this is what makes Him good. He cares for us, enough to shed His blood, and enough to continue chasing after us as we stray. *Lord, keep me from going after other gods. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: John 5:22-30 – Dead and Living Ears

"Whoever hears my word, and believes Him Who sent me has eternal life... he has passed from death to life." We are born dead. We need to be brought to life from the outside. And this happens through our ears. The devil killed Adam and Eve through their ears, bringing them to listen to his killing words instead of the living words of the living God. But God reverses the work of the devil, amazingly, through the same tools. He uses His word and our ears in order to bring us from death to life. He speaks life into our ears, bringing the whole body and soul to life. And He uses these same words to sustain us in that life and to bring us into the resurrection of eternal life. *Lord, thank You for bring me from death to life by Your word. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 13:20, 21 – Equipped with everything good

We can be tempted to think that while we have the main things we need from God, we don't have everything we need. So, we stray and look to other things to fill in the gaps, and those other things end up becoming the most important and we lose sight of the gifts God has given. But, through the death and resurrection of Jesus, God has given us everything that is good. Everything that we need in order to do His will, to lead Holy Christian lives, to face temptation and the devil, to be forgiven our sin, to enter into eternal life. Everything. We, who are in Christ, truly have no lack. *Lord, help me to see that in You and through You I have all things which are necessary and good. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 23 – Chasing us through wagon tracks

The 23rd psalm is truly a wonderful text. In it the Lord reminds us of His great care and provision for our lives in the midst of a world corrupted by sin and covered by death. There's a great reality going on in the text we don't always hear. Paths are wagon tracks, the ruts driven into the ground. Follow is pursue, chase after. So the Lord places us into the deep ruts of His righteousness in order to guide our lives. When we wander out of that path, He chases after us, not with wrath and destruction, but with His goodness and mercy. He then places us back into the wagon tracks, where we are safe and are brought, finally, to the eternal kingdom. *Lord, thank You for protecting me with Your righteousness, and pursuing me when I stray. Amen.*

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
