Around the Word Devotions + the week of April 25-May 1, 2021

THEME OF THE WEEK: He is Risen to Give Us Believing Joy

The Lord promises to preserve us in the midst of all things in this life. He promises to set us at peace, not with the kingdom of this world, but with His kingdom. And in order to accomplish that He has given us His name, He has called us out of darkness to light, He has given us unending mercies, He has gone into the grave and come back out, has promised to hear and answer our every petition, and has given us the promise of the eternal victory over the grave. We therefore rightly praise Him throughout our lives, as we live in the peace of God which surpasses all understanding and comes new every day.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 10:1-9 - A Kingdom of Peace

"Peace be to this house...the kingdom of god has come near to you." The Lord sends out the disciples to proclaim a very specific message: Peace and the Kingdom. The two are not disconnected from one another. The peace of God, that we are set aright with the father because our Lord Jesus has died and risen for our sake, that peace is also where we find the Lord's kingdom. There's the temptation to try and find the kingdom of God in all sorts of external things in this life, but Jesus would have us remember that it's found wherever His word is proclaimed and His gifts are given, and in those things, the Lord bestows upon

us His peace and sets us as heirs in His kingdom. Lord, thank You for declaring Your peace to me through Your church. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 75 – Marked by the Name of God

"O God; we give thanks, for your name is near." This is the great joy of the Christian, that we worship a God who is not far off from us, or who forbids us to speak His name. Rather He gives us His name to use and to call upon in every trouble, to use in prayer, praise, and thanks. He gives His name to rejoice in. And more than that, He gives us His name to be called by and to be marked with. In our baptism He has placed that name upon us. In the benediction He places His name on us again. Over and over we live and move and have our being as those who are marked with the name of Christ: CHRISTians. And so we rejoice and give thanks, for God's name is near, in our lips, and upon our heads. Lord, thank you for marking me with Your name. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 2:11-20 - Free to Serve

"Live as people who are free, not as a cover up for evil, but living as servants of God." This is one of the great mysteries of the faith, that we are set free by God from bondage to sin, and death, and the devil, but not so that we can be free to live however we wish, but so that we can be bound to the Lord's will for our lives. We are taken from one servanthood to another. However, we are indeed free to serve God by living as His holy people, because we're not enslaved any longer to the temporal consequences of this life, rather, we know we already have an eternal inheritance awaiting us, and so we are freed to live in this life faithfully, according to God's Will. Lord, help me always to live, act, and speak, in accord with your will. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Lamentations 3:18-26 - A Love Without End

"The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning." 3 times here Jerimiah uses unconditional terms: "Never, Never, Every". So is the Lord's work to us. He never grows tired of loving us. He never grows weary of bringing us mercy. And so, they come to us every day, the bad days, the good days, and the ho-hum days. And in that they are new to us. For every day we come before the Lord with new sins, more sins, sins against our neighbor and sins against our Lord. And yet, every day, we the Lord looks upon us and smiles because Christ's blood has already made the payment for those sins. Thus He loves, and is merciful, every day. Lord, thank You for Your unending mercies toward me. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: John 14:1-11 - Eternal Neighbors

"In my House are many rooms." It seems sometimes we loose sight of the great beauty that is here. We rejoice that Jesus is promising that He is going to prepare at the cross a place for us in the eternal resurrection. But the promise here is that this work is not just for a couple people, but for many. There is a great multitude, and unnumberable multitude, which will be brought into the resurrection of all flesh, and the Lord has prepared rooms for them all. And that means that in the resurrection, as now, we will have many neighbors with which we may rejoice together in the Lamb who was slain and who now wipes away

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 4:14-16 - A Merciful Ear

"We do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses." Jesus knows our every need, our every issue, our every pain and sorrow, and He knows them in fact, better than we do. He has not only experienced them Himself as He lived in this life as a man of sorrows, rejected by men and from whom men hide their faces, but He has also experienced for our sake the very forsakenness of the Father. SCRIPTURE: Psalm 146 - Trust not in Princes
