Around the Word Devotions + the week of April 3-9, 2022

THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered the Enmity of Unbelievers

"Whoever is of God hears the words of God." Natural man is corrupt and incapable of spiritual discernment. This biblical witness runs counter to the high opinions folks have of the human spirit. But the evidence is undeniable. The loftiness of the human spirit has no room for Christ or God's Word. If anything, the lofty human spirit persecutes Christ and His saints. Jesus suffered this enmity to overcome it. By the perfect sacrificial offering of his death, he ransomed our souls from unbelief. With the blood that flowed from his side bound together with baptismal water by promise, he gives us heavenly birth.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: John 8:46-59 "Belonging to God"

We can manipulate the message of Christianity to make it palatable to the world. It's easy to do. Speak words of blessing and ignore the words that teach repentance. Pick and choose the nice sounding parts of the Bible and ignore the rest. But this is not how Jesus our Lord preaches to his fellow countrymen, the Jews. They began to believe in him, but they tried to fit Jesus' words into their false understandings of what it means to belong to God. Jesus will not share glory with any other false gods and false teachings. That's why the unbelieving flesh must be crucified and die with Jesus. But in this death, we find eternal life.

Jesus raises up hearts to trust and keep his Word. "Grant, O Lord, that I never see death but find life in Jesus' Word." Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 54 "The Upholder of My Life"

Betrayal is bitter. When we love, we open hearts our friends, family, or spouse. In this vulnerability, we're open to unanticipated attack and the wounds inflicted on our heart sting deeply. Our neighbors are sinners. Invariably they will betray our trust. They will wound our hearts opened to them in love. The temptation is to return sin for sin. But that is not the way of one who knows Christ. David was betrayed by the Ziphites. He feared Saul would seize and destroy him. But in his distress he cried to the Lord "the Upholder of my life." Men are faithless. God is faithful. He delivered David, just as he delivers you with the comfort of his promises. "O God, save me by your name and vindicate me by your might." Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 9:11-15 "High Priest"

What does it all mean? Why did Jesus die on the cross? What did it accomplish? How does it help me? The author to the Hebrews, perhaps St. Paul himself, teaches us to understand the cross with faith, trusting not in a mere execution of an innocent man, but in a high priestly sacrifice and offering to gain God's eternal favor forever. The sacrifices of the old covenant had to be performed over and over again. They were not sufficient in themselves to obtain God's favor or to purify consciences. Instead, their value was in preaching a propitiatory sacrifice greater than themselves, the blood of our great High Priest, brought into the presence of God by Christ himself through the eternal Spirit. "Cleanse my conscience from guilt, O Lord." Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Genesis 12:1-3 "The Families of the Earth Shall Be Blessed"

The nations were scattered. No one feared God. No one remembered his name. From among the idolaters of the world, God chose one man with whom to speak. What made Abram more worthy than his countrymen in Haran? Nothing. By grace the Lord spoke to Abram. For the sake of the Seed that would be born from Abram's family, the Lord plucked Abram and his household out of slavery to idols so that he could hear and believe the promises that save by faith. Jesus will deny them before his Father who is in heaven. Dear Christian, take heart when the members of your own family hate you for Christ's sake. As Jesus bore the cross, so you also must bear the cross. Rejoice! Losing everything in this life is gain.

"Whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." "Grant me to bear the cross with faith and hope, O Lord" Amen.
