Around the Word Devotions + the week of August 1-7, 2021

THEME OF THE WEEK: Faithful Stewardship of Earthly Gifts

We are strangers in this world. Even though the dark night of sin and sorrow presses in on us, the Lord's Word shows us the way out of this valley of death to our fatherland of light and life. His Word is a lamp to our feet and a light to our path (Psalm 119:105). Like the saints who have gone before us, we desire "a better country, that is, a heavenly one" (Hebrews 11:6). There we will reign alongside Christ as members of the royal household, adopted by grace (2 Timothy 2:12). What is this world to us? Instead of hording this world's treasures, we generously and liberally use them to aid our heavenward journey and to aid journeys of our neighbors.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 16:1-9 "Shrewd"

With nothing to lose, you are free to use what you have in service to what you love. You do not hold anything back because you know what is coming next. This is the unrighteous manager's lesson. His master's money means nothing to him anymore. He uses the recourses that he has to prepare a future place for himself. In the same way, we should use our failing mammon wisely where it matters, to support the ministry of the eternally saving Word. God be praised that Christ has prepared eternal dwellings for you and all the saints. Why not pay your pastor? Why not support a seminarian? The Christians God saves

through your generosity will receive into their joyous presence. Grant me a generous heart to support the ministry of Your Word, O Lord. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:65-72 (TETH) "Good for Me"

We have these preconceptions of what the Bible says that cause our eyes to scan the text without actually reading it. Too often we miss the Holy Spirit's depth, riches, and wisdom. Take, for instance, this surprising statement from our reading, "Before I was afflicted I went astray, but now I keep your Word." Affliction is good and helps us keep the Law? That doesn't seem right, especially since our society has taught us to worship bodily satisfaction and comfort. And that is the problem. Our flesh is so steeped in idolatry that it needs denial and discipline so the saint can "keep the Word" by fearing God and learning to love eternal treasures. God be praised for afflictions that discipline and bless us. *Grant me patience to bear the cross, O Lord. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 10:6-13 "Examples for Us"

A house divided cannot stand (Mark 3:25). The same is true of the human heart. We have this idea that we can serve two masters, both the priorities of the world and our heavenly Father. We are tempted to divide our time on Sundays so the kids can play with their traveling sports team, assuming they will catch up on Catechism and church stuff later. It is not that we are shouting that we hate God. It is just hard to fit church into the list of other priorities. Remember Israel. Remember their folly. Their hearts were divided over sexuality, the desire for Egyptian comfort, and for better leaders. Because they devoted themselves to the world and their flesh, they could not enter the promised land. *Unite my heart to fear Your name and forgive me for Christ's sake. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 1 Chronicles 29:10-13 "Yours, O Lord..."

When David prays at the end of his life, you can tell that by much suffering and affliction, he has gained true wisdom and godly desire. What precious gifts! He gained wisdom to see that all things belong to God and we have nothing apart from His merciful generosity. He also gained godly desire to give all things back to the God from whom they came, both his soul in death and his treasure in building the temple from which God would preach the Gospel to His people. Such wisdom and godly desire are hard for the flesh to accept which is why we should pray for a life full of years so that our hearts would be prepared like David's to give to God what belongs to Him and to desire to depart this life in saving faith and peace. *Grant me wisdom, O Lord. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Luke 12:32-48 "Like Men Who Are Waiting"

Whether you are a mother, father, husband, wife, son, daughter, or worker, Jesus has given you things to do. According to your calling as Christian, you are to hear the Word and believe it. According to your calling as parent, you are to bring your kids up in the Lord's Word and feed them sometimes. According to your calling as pastor, you are to preach the Word boldly and without fear. If you are a son or daughter, obey. Jesus calls us blessed if He finds us working when He comes back on the Last Day. But woe to us if we give in to sloth and abuse. Thanks be to God! SCRIPTURE: 2 Timothy 1:3-14 "The Aim of Our Charge"

Besides positively speaking the truth, pastors must also identify and fight back against error. If human wisdom is allowed to drown out the Spirit's, then Gospel is invariably turned to Law, grace to works, and Christ into another law-giver. That is why we stick to the pure doctrine handed down to us from the prophets and evangelists which Christ calls His own Word (Luke 10:16) and the foundation for your saving faith and the whole church (Matthew 7:24; 16:18). If the pastor is faithful, three things happen. Love pours out from good hearts. Consciences become good by resting in the knowledge of Christ's atoning sacri-

fice. The saints gain a sincere faith that holds fast to Christ alone. Preserve Your saving Word among us. O Lord. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 139 "You Know"

This psalm is a prayer to the Creator, Sustainer, and Redeemer of the saints. Knowing God is everywhere and involved in everything can create two distinct reactions depending on the state of one's conscience. If your conscience is bad, troubled by guilt and shame, God's presence is terrifying. He brings judgment and wrath. But if your conscience is good, put at peace by the knowledge of Jesus' sufficient sacrifice and His intercession for us with the Father, then God's presence is comfort and help. God be praised! Through baptism we have inherited the sonship from God, not wrath and destruction. God's presence, because he has been reconciled to us through His Son's blood, only gives joy and peace. *Lead me in the way everlasting! Amen.*
