Around the Word Devotions + the week of August 13-19, 2023

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Worship of God Wrought by the Spirit

This week we give attention to the afflictions of God's people and the promises which God has made in the midst of those afflictions. We are buffeted from all sides by the world, the flesh, and the devil, and recognizing in them a kind of preaching of our own weakness and frailty, we flee to the mercy of Christ, who alone is our salvation and our God.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Luke 19:41-48 Wrath and Mercy

In 70 AD, the Roman general Titus would lay siege to the city of Jerusalem for five months, eventually capturing the city and razing the Temple to the ground. Tens of thousands of the inhabitants would perish. Forty years earlier, upon seeing Jerusalem from the heights of the Mount of Olives, Jesus would weep for it because he saw the destruction that will come upon it, a destruction which comes because they refused repentance - "because you did not know the time of your visitation". The wrath of God is real, but so is His mercy in the gospel. You have been visited by Jesus in the preaching of His word which forgives

sins. Repent and believe the gospel that you would live eternally. *Lord, I believe! Have mercy on me! Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:73-80 Merciful Affliction

In the economy of God, it is not only the things which we would count spiritual and temporal goods – a good conscience, earthly blessings, etc. – but also those things which we would count as negative and undesirable which serve God's purpose for us. Listen to the psalmist, "I know, O Lord, that Your judgements are right, and that in faithfulness You have afflicted me" (v.75). The affliction of God amazingly, is a mercy. God does not afflict for no reason, but that we would be humbled by affliction and brought to repentance "For whom the LORD loves He chastens, And scourges every son whom He receives." (Heb.

TUE

12:6). Faced with affliction and your own sin, turn to the Lord. Trust Him. He will deliver you. *Jesus, I trust in You! Let me not be confounded. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Luke 1:39-55 The Blessedness of Faith

Today we remember Mary, Mother of Our Lord. We remember her firstly because God used her to bring about the miraculous virgin birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Truly all generations call her "Blessed!" just as she has said. Thanking God for this mystery, we also look to Mary as an example of faith and trust in God, of what we are to be in God's Church. Listen to Elizabeth speak of her - "blessed is she who believed, for there will be a fulfillment of those things which were told her from the Lord" (vs. 45). That's for us too! God makes promises through His word, and the Christian believes them. That is Mary's way. That is the Church's way. For through this faith we are justified, forgiven, and blessed, just as Mary is! *My soul magnifies the Lord! Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 7:1-7 Talismans

Merriam-Webster defines the word *talisman* as "1. an object held to act as a charm to avert evil and bring good fortune 2. something producing apparently magical or miraculous effects" For the people of Jeremiah's time, the Temple was such a talisman, which replaced true faith in God and its attendant virtues of justice and mercy. We might not think we moderns are so gullible as to believe in talismans, but neither did the Judeans, and yet that's what happened. What do you trust in? Your church membership? That you "got confirmed"? How you vote? How much you give? If something has taken the place of true faith in God

and hearing His word, you have a talisman, a magic blessing-bringer. Lord Jesus, I trust in You **alone!** Let me hear Your word. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 11:16-24 Faithful to the Word

The Jews of Jesus' day were primed to receive their long-promised Savior. And yet when the forerunner came, they called him demonic, and when Christ came they called Him a drunkard. Many of those who were most likely to understand and receive the Gospel, the religious, rejected it. "This generation" is always with us, even today. The approval of culture, even a religious culture or church body (even the LCMS!), is no barometer for biblical faithfulness. God's word alone is to have sway. And through that Word alone, God will continue to call, gather, enlighten, and sanctify His Church. *Lord Jesus, make us seek the*

approval of You and not our culture. Make us faithful witnesses to Your gospel. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 3:7-15 Exhort One Another...

"No man is an island unto himself" wrote the poet and Anglican priest John Donne. We are made for others. The man who is an island, separated from others and alone has no one to serve in Christian love, but also has no one to serve him, to support him, to encourage him. He is alone and that is exactly where the Devil wants us to be. The preacher of Hebrews teaches his congregation (and us) to "exhort one another daily, while it is called 'today' lest any of you be hardened..." (vs. 13). This is what your congregation is for. Look out for one another, pray for one another, encourage one another. Alone you are weak, together with

your congregation, the body of Christ, you are strong in the Lord. *Lord, thank You for my family in Christ. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 143 A Prayer for Deliverance

The Christian has three historic enemies: His sinful flesh, the world, and the Devil. They all rear their ugly heads at different times and in different proportions in our Christian life, and we will not be through with them until the Lord returns. But until that time, we pray this psalm against them. Our old enemies pursue our souls, and yet we are compelled by our faith to call out to our Lord and Deliverer, Jesus, to do battle on our behalf. In His cross He has destroyed what claim our enemies had on us, and now all they can do is tempt, persecute, and accuse us. But they cannot defeat us. We are in Christ, and He is the One Who revives, Who brings our souls out of trouble. *In Your mercy cut off my enemies, and destroy those who afflict my soul. For I am Your servant. Amen.*

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
