Around the Word Devotions + the week of August 7-13, 2022

THEME OF THE WEEK: Living Orthodoxy: Devotion to the Pure Doctrine of God

All around us is a world that is caught up in a lie. The father of all lies, the devil, works tirelessly to bring more ears to hear it and hearts to believe it. We were conceived and born into the lie too; by nature we believed it. But by God's grace and work of the Holy Spirit, we have been brought from the darkness into the light, from the deadly lie into God's truth, in which is life. In that truth we have a solid foundation that cannot be shaken. As we watch a world descend into chaos, we cry out, "Lord, have mercy! Protect and defend us from the devil, from the world, and from ourselves!"

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 7:15-23 - Wolves in Sheep's Clothing are Still Wolves!

Jesus warns us about things that aren't what they seem. Wolves in sheep's pulpits may be pleasing to your ears, but their words are deadly thorns and thistles. They can be outwardly tempting because of the fruit that they produce. But Jesus says that not everyone who calls out, "Lord, Lord!" is sayed. "Beware!" Jesus warns. Sound preaching, however, produces the good fruit of daily repentance and faith in Jesus as well as love for others. Sound preaching yields a harvest of righteousness to the glory of God the Father. "Let Your Words in me take root, that I bear abundant fruit," Amen. (LSB 589:4)

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:57-64 (HETH) - Create In Me a Clean Heart, O Lord

Have you kept the words of these eight verses? I haven't; none of us has. The new man or woman that God has created you to be in Holy Baptism delights in God's Word, but your sinful nature is always dragging you back into the darkness of unbelief. But do not despair...God is stronger than the sin that is at work in you! He has given Jesus to be your forgiveness and His Spirit to be your helper. O God, the earth IS full of Your steadfast love; grant that I may keep Your Word with a pure heart. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Romans 8:12-17 - We Rejoice to Call God "Father"

Adam and Eve sinned by believing the devil instead of the Father. They believed the lie from the father of lies instead of the Father's Truth. Ever since, we have been walking in darkness. God the Father, in love for us, sent His Son to undo the devil's works, and bring us out of darkness into His light. We now call God "Father," rejoicing to be called "children" and "fellow heirs of Christ." Gracious Father, we thank You that You have adopted us out of the kingdom of death and brought us into Your kingdom of light and life! Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 15:19-21 - In the Palm of Jesus' Hand

"I will deliver you out of the hand of the wicked." God has made His people guite a promise, hasn't He? Because of our sin, we should be left to the hand of the wicked and the grasp of the ruthless. Yet the Lord God is gracious. He gave His Son, Jesus, to stand in our place. He gave His back to the whip, His head to the crown of thorns and His hands and feet to the nails. He gave all this to save you and give you into the Father's hand forever. Keep us, Lord, in the palm of Your hand! Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 7:22-29 – Jesus: The Firm Foundation

Everything crumbles and dies. We are reminded of it daily. In the world, in our own country, and even in our own lives. Things that we thought would stand forever come to an end. The Word of the Lord, though, endures forever. In that Word God sets our feet upon the firm foundation of His Son who cannot be overcome. He overcame death and the grave; all who are built upon Him will endure forever with Him. My hope is built on nothing less than Jesus' blood and righteousness; on Christ, the solid rock, I stand! Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Acts 20:17-38 - The Shepherd's Life-Giving Words

A wolf doesn't approach the flock baring its teeth and snarling; he wants to be as un-wolf-like as possible. But before long, it's too late and disaster strikes. Paul warns that false preachers, like wolves, will come in and destroy the flock with their twisted words. Their words sound good but are destructive. Their words point you to yourself and your own desires but away from Christ crucified for you. A wolf's words destroy, but the Shepherd's words give life! Gracious Father, save us from false preaching and guard us with Your life-giving sound doctrine! Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 126 - Singing the Song of Salvation

As we make our way to the house of God tomorrow, consider how it is a foreshadowing of our being gathered to God's eternal presence in the new creation. From the ends of the earth all the people of God will be gathering to the Lord. streaming in to be in His presence forever. Jesus has redeemed us from captivity. The song of salvation and rejoicing is on our lips, "The Lord has done great things for us, and we are glad! Bring back our captivity, O Lord!" Open now Thy gates of beauty; Zion let me enter there. Amen.
