Around the Word Devotions + the week of December 12-18, 2021

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Lord Has Come As Long Promised

The Third Sunday in Advent is known as Gaudete, which is Latin for, "rejoice." Yet, how can we rejoice when this week's passages confront us with the offensiveness of Jesus, restlessness due to distress, and the poverty of our sinful condition? Our rejoicing is found in this truth - the Lord has come as long promised. Taking on human flesh, He came into a world full of sin and death to save us. So, we rejoice knowing that all sorrows are temporary. As night gives way to day and winter to spring, for Christ's sake, sadness gives way to joy, sin to forgiveness, death to resurrection.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 11:2-10 - The Offensive Jesus

What's so offensive about Jesus? Some are offended by Him because of His Words of Law. Herod Antipas didn't like being called to repentance for his affair. So, he threw John in prison. Yet, more offensive than the Law is the Gospel, which is Jesus dying to save us spiritually blind, lame, deaf sinners from our death. "The word of the cross is folly to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God" (1 Cor. 1:18). So, let us remain unashamed of Christ and His Gospel, for "blessed is he who is not offended because of Christ" (Matt. 11:6). O Lord, give me strength to boldly confess your saving Word. Amen.

MON

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 4 – Sleep in Peace

After a long day, we long to lay down in our beds and sleep. Yet, how difficult it can be when the day still weighs upon us. The mind continues to work through events to bring peace of mind. Yet, only true lasting peace comes from the Lord, our righteousness. Are you distressed? Call upon the Lord, and He will hear you. Have you been shamed for your faith? Know that He has set apart His faithful ones in the waters of Holy Baptism. So, go to bed at once and in good cheer. The LORD your God gives you the peace to sleep. *O Lord, be gracious to me and hear my prayer. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 4:1-5 – Servants and Stewards

How should you view your pastor? St. Paul says, "...as servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God." Pastors are servants, or literally, slaves of Christ. They're not called to be people pleasers because they are accountable to Him. They are to serve Him by being faithful to His Word. Every pastor is also a steward of the mysteries of God, that is God's gifts of Holy Baptism, Holy Absolution, and the Holy Supper. These are the sacred mysteries of salvation, which nourish and care for you in every spiritual need. *O Lord, bless all those who proclaim Your truth that we may be preserved in the pure doctrine of Your saving Word. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Malachi 3:1-6 – The Lord Doesn't Change

"The wages of sin is death" (Rom. 6:23). We cannot do anything to change this punishment from the Lord because He does not change (Mal. 3:1). Yet, the Lord's unchanging punishment for sin does not interfere with His compassion for us sinners. The Lord's mercy endures forever. This unchanging mercy is based solely upon the all-sufficient merit of Christ. Because of Him, we are not consumed. We are not destroyed. Instead, He has rescued us from sin and its punishment of death, and has delivered us over to His kingdom of life. *Give thanks to the Lord, for He is good, for His steadfast love endures forever. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Luke 1:39-56 - Exalted by God

The *Magnificat* of Mary has been sung by the faithful throughout the centuries. It declares every person to be a beggar before God. At the same time it reveals God's mercy and lovingkindness toward us sinners. As we cannot exalt ourselves out of the poverty of our sinful condition, the Lord comes down from heaven to help us of humble estate. In the virgin's womb, God takes on flesh and blood to redeem flesh and blood. So, while the Lord cast down those who reject Him in prideful unbelief, He exults the lowly who trust in Him. *O Lord, may my soul always magnify You. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: Romans 1:16-25 - The Powerful Gospel

St. Paul writes that the Gospel is the power of God for salvation. Yet, what is so powerful about the Gospel that it lays hold of sinners and saves us from sin, the condemnation of the Law, eternal death, and the power of Satan? The answer is Jesus. Jesus is the saving content of the Gospel because He alone perfectly fulfilled the Law and suffered God's wrath for sin. Apart from the preaching of Jesus, there is no power or salvation. Only through the preaching of the Good News of Jesus are sinners called to faith and declared righteous as a free gift of God's grace. O Lord, let us not be ashamed of Your Gospel, for it is Your power for salvation. Amen.

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 98 – Sing to the Lord a New Song

Singing is central to our lives as Christians. Through words set to music, we praise God, find comfort, and confess. So, what is this new song that we are to sing? It is the new song of God's salvation from sin and death through Christ. In His crucifixion and resurrection, "The LORD has made known His salvation; He has revealed His righteousness in the sight of the nations." The righteousness and salvation given to us for Christ's sake, apart from our works, is worth singing about not just today, but every day. *O Lord, we praise You for You have done marvelous things. Amen.*
