Around the Word Devotions + the week of February 25-March 2, 2024

THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered the Weakness of His Disciples

The devil afflicts even those whose faith is great. Tormented by temptation, afflicted with accusations against conscience, and seeing their own children oppressed by demons, the saints are driven to pray, "Have mercy on me Lord, Son of David." Our prayers ascend, but help seems slow in coming. In our impatience the devil tempts us to abandon our prayers. David reminds us, "Weeping may tarry for the night, but joy comes with the morning" (Psalm 30:5). Our prayers are precious to the Lord. He answers not because we deserve it, but because of His own mercy purchased and won by the blood of Christ.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 15:21-28 "A Woman of Great Faith"

Faith that's planted in God's promises is stronger than you'd expect. Its roots go deep into the Word in times of affliction and suffering. Such a saint "is like a tree planted by streams of water that yields its fruit in season, and its leaf does not wither" (Psalm 1:3). Though faith seems next to nothing in times of anguish, its strength can move mountains (Matthew 17:20) and withstand demonic foes (Ephesians 6:16). The Canaanite Woman teaches us how tenaciously this faith clings to Christ and His every Word. His momentary silence can't stop her from remembering Scriptures promises. Even what sounds like an insult be-

comes the anchor for her hope. Lord, by my own power I am nothing. Grant me faith that won't let go of Jesus in my time of need. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 130 "Faith for Sinners"

The devil tells us that those who have wrestled their demons and overcome them by sheer determination and will power are alone worthy to speak to God. He'll use the example of your neighbor's good works to shame your daily afflicted conscience. 'Why can't you be more like them? Why haven't you overcome the filth of your soul by now? Do you even believe in Christ?' In this world and on this side of the grave we are burdened with this weakness, but that is so the glory and honor of Christ might alone be magnified. Jesus came to save sinners. Psalm 130 is for sinners. The promises of salvation are for sinners who trust in

Christ and not in their own righteousness. But with You there is forgiveness, that You may be feared. Amen.

TUE

SCRIPTURE: 1 Thessalonians 4:1-7 "The Will of God"

God doesn't want us to think, speak, and act like slaves to the flesh and demons. Sexual immorality, giving our bodies over to passions and desires outside of the godly bonds of marriage, is celebrated by our world. Whereas the Scriptures teach self-control, the world demands immediate indulgence as a moral necessity. The dangers and consequences aren't immediately apparent. Therefore, we must teach the sixth commandment and speak about God's definition of marriage. We must take responsibility over what we show our children. We must uphold chastity in our own lives so that others may see and be encouraged by our joy in the untarnished enjoyment of God's gifts in married and single life. *Make me holy by Your Spirit, Lord. Amen.*

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WED

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 45:20-25 "The Lord Assembles the Church"

The members of the Christian church are "Survivors of the Nations." They are the remnant that is being drawn out of the corrupt and dying world subject to God's wrath and judgment. How are they drawn out of these dark waters? A cry goes out! A preacher lifts his voice! "Turn to Me and be saved, all the ends of the earth! For I am God, and there is no other." The Lord has reached out His hand into the waters of sin and death to save us. He grasps us by His grace. He pulls us into the ark of His church by planting faith in the crucified Christ into our hearts. Who is righteous and strong enough to save? Only the Lord. God be praised our salvation is secure in His pierced hands. *In the Lord all the off-spring of Israel shall be justified and shall glory. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: Mark 9:17-29 "I Believe; Help My Unbelief!"

Can you imagine the frustration of the man whose son the disciples couldn't help? How can there be hope if these hand-picked men have no power to cast this demon out? Jesus diagnoses the problem immediately. Faithlessness. The disciples spoke some words. Nothing happened. Then they wondered if they had what it took without Jesus around to wrestle with demons. Of course they didn't. Their faith in themselves is no faith at all. All things are possible for the one who believes in Jesus alone. There is no contest or struggle with the demon on Jesus' part. He speaks the Word. The demon is put under His feet. When you're tempted to trust in yourself, turn to Jesus instead. Faith in Him is never put to shame. Help my unbelief! Amen.

FRI

SCRIPTURE: James 5:13-20 "Praying Over the Sick"

It's amazing how much of my pastoral vocation comes down to these few verses. I hear the suffering of the saints. I pray for them. I hear of someone's joy. Together we thank the Lord. I visit the sick, pray with them, and give them anointing blessings full of the comfort of the Holy Spirit. The Lord raises up the afflicted, even when their bodies are dying. Their souls find life and comfort in Jesus. More than anything, pastors come bearing the absolution, the forgiveness of sins. Maybe people want some deep insight explaining why they're going through their suffering. But what they really need is to hear their sins are forgiven for Jesus' sake. O Lord, grant me healing of the soul with Your forgiveness so that I may enjoy the resurrection unto life. Amen.

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 25 "Forgive All My Sins"

This is a beautiful psalm to be prayed in times of distress. It reminds us that we are surrounded by enemies. Our neighbors' hearts have been turned by the Evil One to slander and hurt us. False teachers offer vain hope founded on temporal and fallen things. The demons hate us and strive to break through our defenses so we would fall into despair, shame, and vice. Against them, the psalmist sets our eyes on the Lord Jesus. We learn His ways. We follow His paths. We discover rescue and protection from all earthly and spiritual foes. The Lord Jesus comes to our help because He has purchased and won us to be His own possession with His holy precious blood and His innocent suffering and death. Let me not be put to shame, O Lord. Amen.

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
