# Around the Word Devotions + the week of February 7-13, 2021

#### THEME OF THE WEEK: The Lord's Call to Faith in His Grace

The God of creation decides to sort out all things regarding salvation in the preaching of His Word. He does not grant Salvation *before* the Word. He does not grant Salvation *after* the Word. But *IN* and *THROUGH* the preaching of the Word. Jesus came as a Preacher. He cast the Word of God among Israel, calling His people to faith. Tragically, Israel rejected God's Christ—Jesus. They nailed Him to the cross with the help of Rome. But, God raised Jesus from the dead, vindicating His identity and authority to Israel and all creation. Now we, happy fools, have been caught up into the saving work of God through Jesus in the

power of the Holy Spirit.

## SCRIPTURE: Luke 8:4-15 Word and Spirit

We often lose sight of the work of the Holy Spirit in the ministry of Jesus. We want salvation to be a matter of human will power. We say things like, "Why didn't they know?" and, "How didn't they see?" or, "Who doesn't understand what Jesus is saying?" However, for Jesus, as He preaches in the Power of the Holy Spirit, salvation isn't a matter of human will power or understanding but the will and wisdom of God. God by His Spirit-filled Word calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies His Church on earth. You might lament this reality, but that is the wrong reaction. "Why me and not someone else?" Wrong. When God chooses you, that is good news. Not a burden. *God, thank You for choosing me in* 

es you, that is good news. Not a burden. God, thank You for choosing me in Jesus. Take not Thy Holy Spirit from me. Amen.

### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 24 Lift Up Your Heads, O Gates!

God is the boss of everything. Nothing in creation changes Him. As the boss He has ordained that faith alone is what makes the heart of mankind righteous, beautiful, and pure. Out of the righteous heart pour forth good things. The righteous do not degrade their souls to falsity. The righteous do not activate their tongues in lies. Rather, the righteous seek the face of the God of Jacob where He has made Himself known. For David, that location was in Tabernacle: lambs, smoke, and Ark. For us God fully discloses Himself in Jesus. The ancient doors and gates of Jerusalem were waiting for the Christ of Israel. We have Him.

Heavenly Father, You are a good gift giver. Help me always to hold onto Jesus as a treasure from heaven. Amen.

# SCRIPTURE: 2 Corinthians 11:19-12:9 "My Grace is Sufficient"

God takes from His people. He takes from us. He makes us feel less, cut off from desires and objects of worship. By proclaiming the Law, He will even bring us to hell and cast us into manifest sin so that, by the Gospel, He might raise us out of hell and sin and death and give us heaven, forgiveness, and life. Just ask Jesus. Is God going to treat your life differently than Jesus? Are you exempt from the cross? Do you think you are greater than Jesus? Do you think you are greater than Paul? No. God shows no partiality. To Jew, to Gentile, He works the same. He gives Sorrow. He gives Joy. In all these, whatever the case, like Paul we remember God's greatest work: He gave us Jesus. In Jesus I am strong, and in nothing else. Amen.
