Around the Word Devotions + the week of January 14-22, 2024

THEME OF THE WEEK: God Manifested in the Power of Jesus to Create

Epiphany is the revelation of the Savior to the world. Historically, the day had three Gospel readings. The first reading was the visit of the Magi. The second, the Baptism of Jesus. The third, the Wedding at Cana. We have since separated these readings into three successive weeks. Each reading builds upon the last. God manifesting Himself in the flesh: Immanuel, God with us. For that is who this Jesus is, the Son of God Who has come to save us from our sins. He demonstrates that salvation in His miracle, the turning of water into wine. A few short years later, He will promise the wine is His blood. Ceremonial water used to externally clean, is now used to clean internally. Only in Jesus, the Greater Proph-

et Who was to come, do we know God's love that delivers us from Sheol. In His love for us, His churchy bride, we learn to love our own spouses.

SCRIPTURE: John 2:1-11 — Jesus Cleanses Inwardly

Jesus blesses the institution of marriage with His first miracle, turning of water into wine. This isn't just any old water, but ceremonial water used to make one ritually clean. Jesus turns it into wine, which He later promises is His own blood in the Sacrament. There at the altar He makes us not only outwardly clean, but inwardly clean, by forgiving our sins. He gives us forgiveness obtained at the cross where He calls Mary "woman" a second time. He kept the fourth commandment by creating for her a new life under the protection of John. Lord, cleanse us inwardly that we may receive Your benefits at Your altar. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 14 — The Fool Says, There Is No God

The fools says there is no God, because he is his own god. That is why he can dismiss his corrupt and abominable deeds as being good works. He doesn't see his own sin for what it is, a turning away from God. He justifies harming others, as long as he gets his own way. No one does good on his own. Jesus, Who has claimed us and made us new in baptism, does good works through us for our neighbors. Jesus frees your works from sin and corruption by giving you salvation upon the Cross.

Lord, continue to do good through us for our neighbors, Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Romans 12:6-16 a — Using Gifts For Others

Not everyone has the same gifts from God. He is the giver; we the receiver of the gifts. We are to use the gifts of prophecy, serving, teaching, exhorting, contribution, generosity and on for the good of others, not ourselves. That is why God gives us the gifts in the first place, to show Christ and His love made manifest. He is the One whose love is genuine and did what was good by suffering on Calvary's holy mountain. He was constant in prayer, even praying "Father forgive them for they know not what they do" for you.

Lord, You give us all of our gifts, help us use them for the benefit of others. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Deuteronomy 18:15-19 Jesus is Greater than Moses

Rejoice, O formerly lost and deaf ones. The Prophet greater than Moses has come. He has found you and declared His forgiveness, life and mercy into your sinfully deaf and closed ears with His Words. For the speaker, the Prophet, is the Word from the Beginning. He is the Beginning. As Saint John tells us in His Gospel's prologue: "The law was given through Moses; grace and truth came through Jesus Christ." Through Jesus Christ the Prophet, Who provided an Exodus, not from slavery in Egypt, but from sin, death, and devil upon Calvary for you.

Lord, You are the Greater Prophet, help us to heed Your words. Amen

SCRIPTURE: Luke 19:1-10 Jesus and Zacchaeus

Zacchaeus was a wee little man. He climbed up in the sycamore tree to see the Lord's Christ. He was branded a sinner, for he was. As a forgiven sinner, he learned to love his neighbor because Christ created a new heart within him. As a result of the recreating work of Jesus Christ, Zacchaeus gave half of his money to the poor. He returned fourfold anything defrauded. He was lost, but was found by the Son of Man. The Son of Man also found you and enables you to love and serve others.

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 5:21-33 Wives and Husbands

In the Old Testament the priests would lay their hands upon the heads of the animals being sacrificed. Upon the heads the sins would be placed and forgiveness earned. Jesus is the Head. Upon Him was sin placed and salvation earned upon Calvary. You are the Bride, the Church, the one redeemed by the Head. "This mystery is profound, and I am saying that it refers to Christ and the church." This is the model for husbands and wives. He is the sin bearer and gospel proclaimer. She is the receiver, as one who receives from Christ. Lord, help our marriages be reflections of Your love for the Church. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 16 — God Will Not Abandon Our Souls
