Around the Word Devotions + the week of January 7-13, 2024

THEME OF THE WEEK: God Manifested in the Youth of Jesus

At Christmas we celebrate that God has become Man. In Epiphany, we celebrate that the Man Jesus is God. He is God not just from His ascension, resurrection, or baptism, but from the beginning. The Child conceived in the womb of the Virgin Mary, born in Bethlehem, worshiped by the Wise Men, who went to the temple in Jerusalem at age 12 is God. As God in human flesh, Jesus Christ perfectly carried out the duties required by the Law, including both carrying out the business of His Father and submitting to His parents' authority. He did so for us sinners, that His righteousness would be credited to us through faith alone, and

by the same faith alone, we strive to follow His example of faith toward God and fervent love toward one another.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 2:41-52 - Fulfilling the Law of Love toward God and the Neighbor

This is the only event we have recorded in Scripture from Jesus' childhood. While we may be curious as to what Jesus was like as a boy, God in His wisdom gave us all that we need to know. For here we learn that Jesus perfectly fulfilled both tables of the Law, even as a child. He devoted Himself to the things of God and was obedient to His parents according to the Fourth Commandment. This, then, is what God wants us to know about Jesus' childhood: Christ, the Son of God, was obedient under the Law for us. *Lord Jesus, as You loved both God and Your neighbor, help us by Your grace to do the same. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 13 – The Loving Discipline of the Lord

In times of trial, it's easy to think that God has forgotten us or perhaps even that He has turned His face against us. But the Bible teaches us that the cross is not a tool of God's hatred but His love: "The Lord disciplines the one He loves." (Hebrews 12:6a) When we are in the depths of sorrow, let us follow the example of David and turn to the Lord in prayer. In boldness and confidence we bring our complaints before Him, and with the same confidence we believe that He will ultimately deal bountifully with us. *O Lord our God, hear our prayers and grant us deliverance from all our afflictions. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Romans 12:1-5 - By the Mercies of God

The Old Adam cannot stand the thought of self-sacrifice. He is concerned with his own honor and glory, even if that means treating others with contempt. But as Christians we rejoice to present our bodies as living sacrifices, not thinking of ourselves more highly than others but serving the other members of the Body of Christ. We do so by the mercies of God alone, for by faith we know that the Lord Jesus humbled Himself even to death on the cross for us, so that in Him we might have the hope of the glories of heaven. *O God, by Your mercies help us to be living sacrifices before You. Amen.* WED

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 61:1-3 – Jesus is True God and True Man

Jesus of Nazareth is no mere man. To consider Him to be nothing more than a prophet, saint, or teacher, even if He were the greatest and best of these, is to reject Him in unbelief. No, Jesus of Nazareth is both true Man and true God. He is the Second Person in the Holy Trinity, from whom, as with the Father, the Holy Spirit proceeds. Therefore the spiritual gifts Jesus possesses are not limited, like with other men, for the Holy Spirit is and remains Christ's in fullness for all eternity. *Heavenly Father, grant us Your Holy Spirit to confess Your Son, Jesus Christ, to be Lord and God. Amen.*

THU

SCRIPTURE: Mark 10:13-16 - Receive the Kingdom of God like a Child

It's not just that little children, even infants, can believe in their Lord Jesus Christ. Jesus says that they are the model believers, the example which every Christian should seek to imitate. For Christ wills that we trust in Him and Him alone for salvation, without trying to mingle in our own works or efforts. As the baptized children of God, let us recognize our complete and total dependance on God for every blessing, and let us rejoice that Jesus loves us and grants us all that we need for our bodies and souls now and forever. *Heavenly Father, grant us, Your dear children, faith in You alone for every good gift. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 6:1-4 – Love for Others in the Lord

Jesus found no conflict between His duties toward His heavenly Father and toward Mary and Joseph. To love your neighbor as yourself is like the command to love the Lord with everything you have. We who are baptized into Christ follow His example of love. We love God, and this is seen in love for others. In the home, love is lived out as children obey their parents and parents bring up their children in the Christian faith. Loving God and loving our family shouldn't conflict, for all that we do as Christians toward our neighbors is "in the Lord." *Heavenly Father, thank You for the great blessing that You have given us in our family. Amen.*

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 86 – Teach Me Your Way, O Lord

"As we have heard this week, Jesus fulfilled the Law on our behalf, loving God and His neighbor perfectly. Like little children, we trust in Him completely for our salvation, even in times of trial and tribulation. We are also thereby strengthened to follow His example of love and service toward our neighbor, especially in the home. We know all this only because the Lord has taught us His way. In His pure Word alone, unmingled with any human teachings, we walk through this life in God's truth, the pure doctrine that leads us to our eternal home in heaven. *Teach me Your way, O Lord, that I may walk in Your truth. Amen.*
