THEME OF THE WEEK: God Manifested in the Youth of Jesus

We know very little of the youth of Jesus. St. Luke spends a lot of time on the birth narrative but skips right over all of His youth except for one event that happened when Jesus was twelve. It is worthwhile to ponder that, connected to the Nativity of Jesus we know that Jesus became human and lived all aspects of humanity, even childhood. How easy is it for children and teens to feel disconnected from Jesus when they don't think about Jesus ever being the same age as them. Yes, Jesus knows all aspects of humanity and came to redeem all nations, from the littlest to the oldest.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 2:41-52 Lost and Found

I remember being lost in a store when I was a child. The fear caused my heart to race. I looked for my family, those familiar faces that would mean I'm where I'm supposed to be. I then lived the flip side when one of our children hid in a clothes rack and we lost him in a store. We can become lost, and even more so, we can lose our way in life. We wander on the wrong paths; paths of injustice and iniquity. Jesus never lost His way and He seeks out and saves the lost. The Good Shepherd cries out to His sheep and we know the voice of our Savior. You are found by God and put into the family of your church. SCRIPTURE: Psalm 13 How long, O LORD?

SCRIPTURE: Romans 12:1-5 Transformed by the Grace of God

A parent would like to conform their children to be exactly like they intend. A parent attempts to model the behavior and attitude that they want their child to have. They are trying to conform their child to themselves. Instead of conforming children to the world, children, along with adults, are transformed by the will and Word of God. God doesn't try to conform us to Himself but rather does a more radical thing. He transforms us. He changes our substance. United by faith in him we have union with Him and are transformed to be like Him. This in turn changes our behavior to be holy and acceptable. *Spirit, by Your working, transform me to be holy as You are holy. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 61:1-3 Waiting for the Lord

One of the universal feelings of just about any child is exasperation. Every time they hear "no" they get frustrated about one more thing they don't get or can't do. For parents, the answer to this is to raise children "in the discipline and instruction of the Lord." The Christian faith takes away guilt because all sin is erased in Jesus. For children, the answer is the same. A child's faith in God shows them that their parents are doing what is right in the eyes of the Lord. Lord God, keep me faithful to Your Word all of my days. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 86 Taught the Way of the Lord
