### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:9-16 "A Pure Way"

The young men are attacked in our culture with corrupting vice. There are powerful forces on the other side of their screens trying to entice them into carnal thoughts and justifications for all manner of sin. "How can a young man keep his way pure?" Now more than ever we need to hear, "By guarding it according to Your Word." The Word of the Lord contends and wins against the corrupting influences of the world. We don't become accomplices to our neighbor's suicidal unbelief. Even if it costs us the world's hatred, we call to repentance and preach Christ alone. *Grant me boldness, O Lord, to love my neighbor as You have loved me. Amen.*

#### SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 25:6-9 "For All Peoples"

The pall that covers the peoples is death. Apart from Christ the gentiles contrive their own ways of dealing with it, everything from philosophy to uploading their consciousness into the cloud. Yet, the pall remains until death is swallowed up. "Death is swallowed up in victory!" Whose victory? Christ's. He has atoned for the world's sin. He has reconciled us to God. The peoples who sat in darkness are now bathed in the light of the Gospel, the light of the knowledge of Christ. There is no greater feast than this

### SCRIPTURE: Luke 14:25-35 "Godly Hatred"

What competes in your heart for the fear, love, and trust that ought to be in God alone? Folks will readily admit the crasser idols they're struggling with, things that have to do with money or pleasure. Far harder it is to admit that one's family can supplant Christ. For the sake of offending fathers, mothers, sisters, and aunts, I've seen too many people keep themselves from the divine service and the true confession of Christ. Because family can be a powerful idol, Jesus uses the strong word "hate." Going to church can cost you. Count the cost and realize that it may come with being rejected by family. And yet, with Christ

is the treasures of heaven and reconciliation with God. It's worth it. Every time. *Grant me true faith that never waivers, O Lord. Amen.*

### SCRIPTURE: Revelation 3:14-22 "Gold and Garments"

Having it good isn't all it's cracked up to be. Comfortable Christianity isn't the goal. To think that we need nothing, that the stuff we surround ourselves with in our materialistic, consumeristic life is what it takes to be happy, is the revolting tepid water that Jesus spits out. Though surrounded by things and worldly riches, Jesus calls us "wretched, pitiable, poor, blind, and naked." Instead of resisting suffering, maybe we should be ready to embrace it. "Those whom I love, I reprove and discipline, so be zealous and repent." Amen. For our riches, let us repent and turn to Christ Who gives the gold of grace and the gar-

ments of righteousness through baptism. *Grant me to receive my crosses with faith and joy, O Lord. Amen.* 

### SCRIPTURE: Luke 1:57-80 "Prophesy"

For the sin of doubt, Zechariah was silenced. Sin always carries consequences in this life, even when its guilt has been forgiven before God in heaven. Then again, what greater build up to a heavenly crescendo of revelation could be imagined than what happened through Zechariah. David's son and Lord is here. He will save us from our enemies. John will prepare His way by preaching the knowledge of salvation "in the forgiveness of sins." God be praised for this wonderfully clear prophesy of our God's saving work! *Blessed be You*, *Lord God of Israel! Amen.*
