Around the Word Devotions + the week of June 4-10, 2023

THEME OF THE WEEK: The One True God: the Father and the Son and the Holy Ghost

Trinity Sunday celebrates the mystery of three persons and the unity of divine essence at the end of the first half of the Church Year. Unlike what happened earlier in the year, we are not celebrating a historical event, but a doctrine. This is the day we celebrate the Three-in-One and One-in-Three God. We confess the Athanasian Creed which lays out the doctrine of the Trinity, which one needs to confess to be saved. We see this doctrine in all of our readings this week. We begin with Nicodemus seeing Jesus at night and being told about being born again by the Spirit to know the Father. We continue to see the Trinity in the hymns of praise we offer because we havebeen named in Baptism. We end by coming into His presence to offer up our prayers.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: John 3:1-15 - Nicodemus and the Light

Nicodemus is, at first, afraid of the Light. He prefers the darkness where his sins, motives, and questions remain hidden. He has questions like: "How can I be born again?" Jesus replies that a person needs the Spirit because the Spirit reveals the Son, and to know the Son is to know the Father. All three are connected in, by, and through love as Augustine taught. It is love that caused the Father to send the Son to be the Light. It is love which causes the Spirit to use Water and Word to give men new birth in the Light. Lord, help us to live in the Light of Your Son. Amen.



SCRIPTURE: Psalm 8 - Tiny Man

When compared to the cosmos that God created, man is tiny. Insignificant. Smaller than an ant is to us. Yet, when it comes to praying to God, man is gigantic. Our babies and infants give testimony to the greatness of God. The Son of Man sat crowned with glory and honor upon the cross of Calvary. All of creation is placed under His nail-pierced and resurrected feet. On account of Him, we are set free to pray and praise the majestic-ness of the Triune Name.

O Lord, our Lord, how majestic is Your name in all the earth! Amen.

TUE

SCRIPTURE: Romans 11:33-36 Theology and Doxology

From, through, and to Him are all things. From this, we learn that Theology and Doxology (teaching and worship) are twins. One is not seen without the other. To know God is to praise God and to praise God is to know God. This is not just any God, but the Three-in-One eternal God. From this God, we are brought to faith (The Spirit), through whose birth, death, and resurrection all are redeemed (The Son), and to whom we give all thanks and praise (The Father). Three Persons, yet One God. Co-equal. *Eternal. Father, help us praise You aright. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Ezekiel 18:30-32 Dying to Old Life

God takes no pleasure in the death of anyone. Rather, we are called to turn and live. That is, repent by turning away from sin and turning towards the Lord. This involves dying to your old way of living, the life of darkness and sin. Dying to putting yourself first and making an idol out of everything. Instead, rise in Christ. Live in Him. Live joyfully in the new life of Baptism: in Light and forgiveness and love. Lord, help us repent and live in Jesus. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 28:18-20 Baptismal Name

Jesus' final command to His disciples is to go baptize with the forgiveness of sins. But they are not alone in this job. He is with them, for they are the Church and Jesus is always with His Church. As they go, He goes. As they baptize, He baptizes and makes His own. You have been baptized in the Triune name of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and so you can enter the presence of God with joyful singing and the receiving of His gifts. So remind yourself you are baptized with the sign of the cross often. *Lord, keep us in Your baptismal name. Amen.*

FRI

SCRIPTURE: 2 Corinthians 13:14 Grace Love Fellowship

We enter God's presence through Holy Baptism. Being marked in the Triune Name we confess our sins and are absolved. Only in the Triune Name do we receive His gifts; His Word, His Sacraments. We respond with the giving of thanks and praise. Then, when the Divine Service concludes, we are sent out with the name of God upon us until we meet again. Until then, God promises to give us more gifts — the keeping of us in grace, love, and in fellowship with each other. God does it all for you. God keep us in your grace, love and fellowship. Amen.

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 143 Soul Thirsts for God

The psalmist is in trouble. His enemy has "crushed my life to the ground, he has made me sit in darkness like those long dead." He has nowhere to go, only to reach out towards God. He places His trust in God, he flees for refuge in Him. He is the servant. God will deliver him from his enemies. So who are the enemies but the devil, the world, and our sinful flesh? Who is God but the One who created, redeemed, and sanctifies us in the one true faith?

Lord, keep us in the one true faith. Amen.
