## Around the Word Devotions + the week of June 6-12, 2021

#### THEME OF THE WEEK: The Spirit's Words in Holy Scripture

St. Paul concludes 1 Corinthians 13 with "So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love." All three of these: faith, hope, and love are in our readings for this Octave of Trinity. The rich man lacks love for a neighbor, for he loves his possessions rather than God who reveals Himself in His Word. His neighbor, Lazarus, has faith that clings to God's mercy in Christ. The believer, like Lazarus who hopes in the life of the world to come, will be vindicated when we are redeemed from the sinful world like David was from Saul.

# SUN

#### SCRIPTURE: Luke 16:19-31 — The Rich Man and Lazarus Both Die

The ancients had a phrase that some still use today. "Memento mori," meaning "remember you will die." Scripture tells us that death is the consequence of sin. Because all sin, all will die. The rich man lived as if God did not exist. Consequently, he had neither love nor compassion. Life was all about himself, not trusting God and not loving his neighbor who was suffering literally at his door. Far from being smothered by riches, Lazarus suffered. He couldn't escape the law and sin. He was reminded in his flesh constantly of sin's wages. This is good. Suffering taught Lazarus to believe in Abraham's Seed and Lord. By this faith

Lazarus was saved. Lord, thank You for opening our ears to hear and believe the Word of salvation. Amen.

### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:1-8 (ALEPH) — The Law of God is Our Delight

"Blessed is the man...his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on His law he mediates day and night." (Psalm 1:1) "Blessed are those whose way is blameless, who walk in the law of the Lord!

Blessed are those who keep his testimonies." (Psalm 119:1-2a) Blessed are you who love the Word of God. Apart from God's grace extended through the Word we are covetous, sinful and unclean. How can we say that the Law is our delight? The Word of God is powerful. It works not only faith in God's promises that save, it also turns our hearts to love all God has said and commanded. Praise God that He does not abandon you in sin. He brings you to himself

through loving words of mercy merited by Jesus' blood. Lord, help me to delight in Your Word. Amen.

#### SCRIPTURE: 1 John 4:16-21 — How Can We Know Love?

God is love. Look to His Word which declares that while we were still sinners Christ died for us. This is God's love and it saves us. Both Testaments also reveal how we are to love God, with all of our heart, soul, and mind. Our love for others reflects God's love. On the Day of Judgement, everyone will see how the Christians were Christ's hands to mercifully provide for the world. Don't be afraid of that day. When you stand before the Father, you are already judged righteous on account of Christ alone. Lord, thank You for first loving us. Amen.

#### SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 9:23, 24 — Wisdom Without Faith is Dead

This world's wisdom cannot save. We need something better. True wisdom begins with the fear of the Lord. After we've been chastened to fear God's judgment through the Law, God delights to show us his Wisdom hidden from before the world's foundation: His Son and our Savior, Christ. Divine Wisdom is grasped by faith alone. Therefore we do not stand before God on the strength of our merits, wisdom, or riches. We stand before Him trusting in the Wisdom of the Word made flesh. Jesus, God's Incarnate Wisdom, lifted high upon the cross of Calvary, makes us holy and precious to God. Lord, help us lean not on our own understanding, but upon Your Word. Amen.

#### SCRIPTURE: Luke 12:13-21 — Covetousness Leads to Death

Quick rule: if you ask Jesus a law question or statement, you will get a law answer. Example: "tell my brother to split the inheritance..." (verse 13) Answer: You are to be "rich toward God" or "rich in the sight of God." Is Jesus decrying wealth? Not exactly. He is diagnosing the sin of putting our trust in earthly riches. If our hearts are greedy and covetous of having bank accounts full of money and large estates, will our trust in them save us from sin and death? Jesus says, "Where your treasure, is, there will your heart be also." Thanks be to God for the saving treasure in every Christian heart; Jesus as He is proclaimed in the Word, who hantized you, and who feeds you with His yeary body and blood. Lord.

### SCRIPTURE: 1 Timothy 6:6-19 — Love of Money is Death

Continuing from yesterday's theme, Paul tells us that "the love of money is the root of all kinds of evils." This applies to the Church. How easy it is to sacrifice the teachings of the Word of God here and there for the achieving and maintaining of earthly gains. Wealth cannot buy contentment or freedom from death, as the rich man demonstrated Sunday. Rather, rejoice in what you have from the Father. He provides all that we need in this body and life, even the forgiveness of your sins in His Son, our Lord of lords. Lord, help us to rejoice in all that you gracious give us. Amen.

#### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 34 — Bless the Lord At All Times

"I will bless the Lord at all times." Notice that David did not limit this to good times, times of peace and prosperity, or times of abundance. David wrote this reminder when he was on the run from King Saul. Only those who are God's people, called to faith through the Word, can be thankful at all times. Secured in Christ and His righteousness, we know that the evil we suffer in this fallen and sinful world will end when the Lord comes and redeems us. *Lord, help us to bless You in all circumstances. Amen.*
