## Around the Word Devotions + the week of March 26-April 1, 2023

#### THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered the Enmity of Unbelievers

Jesus came into the world to save the world. Yet men were so twisted by the corruption of the flesh and the devil's lies that they hatefully rejected Christ's gracious words and actions. Jesus humbly preached that He desired nothing but their redemption. In response, they desired to kill Him. This same enmity of unbelief continues to stand against Christ's Word. And yet, against the contrary wills of the devil and flesh, the greater will of God prevails. The Jews rejection didn't stop Jesus' from reconciling them to the Father through His cross. So also,

Christ's Word fights tirelessly against our hard hearts turning them from unbelief to faith.

### SCRIPTURE: John 8:46-59 "If I tell the truth, why do you not believe me?"

Men love the echoes of their own opinions bouncing around inside their heads. But what happens when their beliefs are challenged? In anger they instinctively reject contrary assertions. What about the truth? If anything, the truth elicits a violent rejection since it strikes at the heart of the devil's power. Satan holds men captive through faith in a lie, that they don't need a savior from sin. Jesus confronts the lie knowing His humble, gracious revelations of saving truth will be rejected. Yet, from incomprehensible love, He persistently bears witness saying, "If anyone keeps my Word, he will never see death." Jesus' boldness has saved you. His truth broke the powerful lie and planted saving

boldness has saved you. His truth broke the powerful lie and planted saving faith in your heart. *Thank You, O Christ, for saving me. Amen.* 

### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 54 "The Prayer of the Betrayed"

The context for this Psalm is 1 Samuel 23:15-29. Saul unjustly sought David's life because he was driven mad with envy. Such are fruits of demonic attack. But as if one enemy wasn't enough, the Ziphites betrayed David's location. Men are weak. Their promises mean little to nothing. Therefore, David didn't cast himself on the mercy of men in the hour of his betrayal but on the constancy of God. Why? The Lord is faithful. David trusts in the Lord who keeps His promises, even when it looks like everything has turned against him. Just as David's hope was vindicated, so will your hope in Christ. The devil's power over you is ending. Sin's time is running out. Though all you have is the Word, it is enough. O God, vindicate me by Your might. Amen.

### SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 9:11-15 "A High Priest"

As we draw closer to Good Friday, our hearts anticipate the mysteries of the cross. Historians note the death of a religious outsider. Some people calling themselves Christians wish that Jesus' life wouldn't have been cut short so He could have succeeded in His mission. The Holy Spirit's view is wildly different. Jesus wasn't a helpless man caught up in forces outside of His control. He is the High Priest who offered Himself on the altar of the cross "thus securing an eternal redemption" and purifying our consciences "from dead works to serve the living God." Reason cannot attain this truth, but faith swells in our hearts with joy to hear that He is the mediator of a New Testament of grace. *Your cross is my life, O Christ. Amen.*

### SCRIPTURE: Matthew 10:32-42 "The Blessings of Confession"

He knows that you'll suffer rejection from friends, family, and be maligned by the powers of government. Take heart. Though you

lose the world, you gain heaven and the life of the world to come. Lord Jesus, keep me steadfast in my confession. Amen.

#### SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 1:21-31 "Boast in the Lord"

This lesson gives understanding. Why did the Jews reject Jesus? They wanted signs. But their eyes were never satisfied. When the sign of Jonah was given them, it still wasn't enough. They stumbled. Why did the Greeks reject Jesus? They sought wisdom. But the ultimate revelation of God's glory being displayed through a dying man on a cross was folly to them. Their minds couldn't grasp the simplicity and majesty of God in suffering. Where the eyes and mind fail, the heart succeeds, not because it has a power in itself to catch God, but because it is the organ of faith, filled to the brim by the calling of the Holy Spirit. The cross may be low and despised, dear Chrisitan, but to you it is the power and wisdom of God. I boast in You. O Lord. Amen.

### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 27 "One Thing"
