Around the Word Devotions + the week of March 28-April 3, 2021

THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered All the Penalties of Human SIn

This Holy Week, our meditations revolve around two themes. Firstly, we focus on the afflictions which we experience as Christian sinners, as well as the suffering which our Lord endured to obtain our hope in the midst of those afflictions. Secondly, we meditate on the unmerited graciousness of our heavenly Father in Jesus Christ.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 21:1-9 Why Palms?

It is not that they had nothing else. Jerusalem was replete with riches that she could have welcomed Jesus with banners of silk or brightly colored fabric. The people deliberately cut palms as a symbol of Jewish pride. Palm branches were used at least since the Maccabean period in processions of victory (see 1 Maccabees 14:51) and were used on Judean coinage. As a Jewish deliverer who would rout the Romans and elevate the Jews, Jesus is ultimately a disappointment to Jerusalem. Jesus is Savior from sin and death. He has come that they, and we, would have life by His cross. We take up palms today as those with feelings just as confused as Jerusalem's, but by faith in Christ we wave palms of victory forevermore (Revelation 7:9). Hosanna in the highest. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 61 The Immovable Rock

David may have written this psalm when he had to flee during Absalom's rebellion. It is a prayer of faith and praise when all seems upset. When all of life's securities fail and you are left with uncertainty, only in the tabernacle of God's mercy can you find true security and solace. The Rock which is higher than you, the One that does not move when all is crumbling around you, the One in which you take refuge is the Lord Jesus. His word is true. He does not lie. Faith indeed wants to abide in His tabernacle forever. There you will not be moved. Lord Jesus, be my Rock and my Fortress, a strong tower against the enemy. Amen.

TUE

SCRIPTURE: Philippians 2:5-15 For Us and In Us

Where we seek glory, Jesus made Himself of no reputation. Where we want to be masters, Jesus came to serve. Where we buck at authority, Jesus became obedient, even to a shameful death on the cross. But dear soul, this is not merely an example that our Lord gives you, though it is that. He has come to obey the law in your stead, to fulfill all that is necessary for you to be with Him forever. He makes you righteous by faith. He also invites you to share in His divine life with him, to do as he does according to the goodness of the law. Justified by faith in His blood, you do as He does, and that, dear soul is a blessing. Lord Jesus, You did not spurn to humble Yourself for my sake. Grant that by Your Holy Spirit, I too may act in humility toward God and to others. Amen.

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WED

SCRIPTURE: Zechariah 9:9, 10 Just and Having Salvation

"Behold, thy King cometh unto thee: He is just, and having salvation" (KJV). There are no greater attributes in a god you could find for sinners in need, for us wayward daughters of Zion. He is not a persnickety god who condemns you on a lark, or a god who demands his pound of flesh to save you. He is the Lord, He is just, His dealings with us are right. His judgement is true (John 8:16). And this just King has salvation. He procures a salvation for all, regardless of who or what they have trusted, who or what was their king - He has come to save them. He comes to you, wayward one. Palms and branches, nails and scourge, folded linens and a borrowed tomb, words and bread and wine. He comes. Rejoice greatly. Lord Jesus, You are my King! Amen.

THU

SCRIPTURE: Mark 14:3-9 Gospel Waste

There is something in us that would be pragmatic. But not the Lord. Jesus is the vineyard owner Who pays for work unperformed, the unfathomable Shepherd who dies for the sheep, the One who kills the fatted calf for His wayward prodigal. In his treatment of us, the Lord is not stingy, He spares no expense, even His own precious blood to save us. It is no wonder then that He so lavishly praises this woman for her seemingly wasteful gesture. This is exactly how He acts! Her good work, her beautiful thing that she did, is the gospel in action — wasteful, lavish, nothing held back in love for another. So it is for us sinners—

the Lord's precious blood is lavished on us by water and word. Lord Jesus, pour out Your lovingkindness on me, a poor miserable sinner. Amen.

FRI

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 12:1-11 Chastening of Love

The life of the faithful this side of glory is a battle from beginning to end. Our flesh, the world, and the devil beset us every day of our life. But these things do their part for us in showing us that we, in ourselves, are neither holy nor sufficient. Our bodies break, much like our resolutions and intentions. The devil hurls his fiery darts at us. The world despises us. The Lord indeed tempts no one, but "the Lord loveth, He chasteneth, and scourgeth every son whom He receiveth." The Lord is treating you as sons. The Father brings you down the path of His own Beloved Son, that through faith in His shed blood, your way would

lead as His did, to the resurrection and the life of the world to come. Father, chasten me as Your own, lovingly, and for my good. Amen.

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 67 Mercy and Blessing

'God be merciful unto us, and bless us: and cause his face to shine upon us." Mercy. Blessing. The loving countenance of God. God wants to give sinners these things. So, Dr. Luther writes "Everything, therefore, in the Christian Church is ordered to the end that we shall daily obtain there nothing but the forgiveness of sin through the Word and signs, to comfort and encourage our consciences as long as we live here." (LC II:55). Where the Word and Sacrament are, there is the Church, and the mercy and blessing of God which bestow upon you a good conscience. The Lord's face shines upon you as you receive what He has bled to give you. So tomorrow, go – receive mercy and blessing, and have peace in the Lord. Lord have mercy upon us. Amen.

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
