Around the Word Devotions + the week of May 7-13, 2023

THEME OF THE WEEK: He is Risen to Proclaim the Truth

Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia! The joy and light of the Lord's resurrection continues to enlighten our hearts and minds this week. The Scripture passages selected this week put before us the tremendous gifts of God for us. God gives us His Spirit, His righteousness, His deliverance, His freedom, His forgiveness, and His enduring promise of everlasting life with Him. God be praised!

SUN

SCRIPTURE: John 16:5-15, The Advantage of Jesus Departure

The night before the crucifixion Jesus tells His disciples, "It is to your advantage that I go away." How could that possibly be the case? What could be better than having Jesus there with them? "If I depart, I will send Him to you." Who? The Holy Spirit, here called the *Parakletos* in Greek, the Comforter, the Helper, or (best) the Advocate who will bring about faith in your heart and peace in your conscience. He will convict the world of sin, righteousness, and judgment, and He will guide the church into all truth. This is the advantage, and we have it. We are born of water and the Spirit, and Jesus has sent the gift of the

holy Spirit to all who are baptized. O Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of Your faithful people. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 82, God among the gods

God stands among the gods. There is only one God: the Holy and blessed Trinity. But there are plenty who exalt themselves, who live like they are gods, who live by power and trample on the poor and needy. There are many who cast aside God's law and live like they matter most. This Psalm is a prayer for deliverance from these false gods, and brings the assurance that our God, the true God, will help. "Arise, O God, judge the earth. You shall inherit the nations" (Psalm 82:8). Jesus will not be overthrown. His is the kingdom and the power and the glory forever and ever. In His kingdom there is nothing to fear.

Lord Jesus Christ, deliver us from all evil of body and soul, now and forever. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: James 1:16-21, Brought forth by the Word

The Christian has a second birth. The first birth is of the flesh, but the second birth is of the Word. "Of His own will He brought us forth by the word of truth, that we might be a kind of firstfruits of His creatures." When we hear and believe the "implanted word, which is able to save our souls," a new life is begun. Washed with the water and the word, we no longer belong to sin, death, and the devil. We belong to God. We belong to righteousness and life. We belong to the light and to truth. We are adopted into His family. And note this: because this new life comes about by hearing the word, it is shaped by being "quick to hear, slow to speak, and slow to anger." O Holy Spirit, open our ears to hear Your Word and cling to Your live-giving promises. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 12:1-6, The Song of the End of God's Anger

What a hymn Isaiah teaches is to sing to God: "Though you were angry with me, Your anger is turned away, and You comfort me!" How is God's anger turned away? Certainly not through our efforts, through our attempts to make it right, through our goodness or good works. No. That could never be enough. God's anger is turned away through the suffering and death of Christ. The cross is the turning point where the wrath of God is poured out on the Lamb of God, and not on the sinners who earned it. God is not our destruction; He is our salvation. We will trust and not be afraid. He has done excellent things! *O LORD, I praise You.*

You were angry with me, but Your anger was turned away, and You comfort me. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: John 8:21-36, The Son's Freedom

The devil tempts us to think that breaking God's Law is like breaking out of prison. "His commands are like chains, and sin is freedom." The devil promises liberty while making us slaves of corruption, "for by whom a person is overcome, by him also he is brought into bondage," (2 Peter 2:19). Our flesh chains us to our lusts and wicked desires. Jesus says, "Whoever commits a sin is a slave to sin." But the Truth will set us free. "If you abide in My word, you are My disciples indeed, and you shall know the truth, and the truth shall set you free." Instead of the slavery to sin, death, and the devil, Jesus is our freedom, our forgiveness our life and our salvation. O Son, set us free, and we will be free
