THEME OF THE WEEK: Resisting the Wicked World

This week's passages are not about resisting the wicked World, as much as they are about keeping our eyes on Jesus and our hearts on God's promises. When we come to church we face the Altar, Lectern, and Pulpit. We are looking for good gifts from God. He always delivers. The backspin of the work of God given in His Word and Sacraments is that we will, in faith, resist the wicked world. Sometimes we actively resist. But by God's grace much of our struggle will be passive. Look to Jesus. What did He do to resist the wicked world? He trusted God, His Father, and He consequently suffered at the hands of men. Then God raised Him

in victory. The world's wickedness was unable to stop the atoning blessings of His death and saving Word.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 22:15-22: Your Sinful Heart: It's Pernicious

The Pharisees will use anything to catch Jesus in His words. They have tried the Scriptures. They have tried tradition. Now, they are trying government. Your sinful heart is pernicious like theirs. We will try to justify ignoring Jesus, resisting His word, working against His Will, in just about any way we are able. How many times have we been willing to throw the kitchen sink at God to keep from doing the one thing necessary: repenting of our sins and trusting in the Gospel? Jesus is not looking for a fight. He does not want your works of penance. He especially does not want your hard-headed unrepentance. He wants

your death to sin and resurrection to life. Oh God, help me daily die well. Let there be less of me, and more of Jesus. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 124: God's Faithfulness Saves

The Church is a testimony to the world. The world is not a light. The world is not an end. The Church is the end. Jesus Christ is the end. He is everything. So, when the world is going to hell as it is right now and always has been, why do we get so caught up into its purposes? Let us, rather, get more caught up into Jesus. The Lord has blessed us. He has taken us away from sin, death, and hell and handed us over to His Son. The most beautiful thing we can do now is daily believe and trust in this Lord Jesus. The most beautiful thing we can do is daily proclaim, loudly, that God is at Work in the Church giving heaven in Christ.

In Him we have received all we need to occupy and clarify our vision, tongues, ears,

SCRIPTURE: Mark 12:41-44: Faith Gives Everything

Faithful people do not hold grudges and weaponize their service and attendance in the Church. They do not show-off their sacrifices. These are the power games the world loves.
