SCRIPTURE: John 15:1-17 Abiding and Bearing Fruit in Jesus

"Apart from me you can do nothing" (v. 5). These are bold words! What does Jesus mean by them? Surely people do all kinds of things without Jesus; dumb things, evil things, fruitless things. To do anything fruitful, anything truly good, however, one needs to be connected to the Vine, connected to Jesus. Apart from Jesus there is nothing fruitful, nothing truly good. All of these promises are yours as God's beloved and redeemed child in Christ. Do not let the world fool you. Do not let the evil one deceive you. Do not let your sinful nature lead you astray. You belong to God, not to the ways and whims of the world. You are His child and He is your Father. When you fail to remember, when you fail to live like His child, when sin gets the best of you, confess your sin, give it to Jesus and cling to the promises of God. Thank You, O Lord, for Your love in Christ that cleanses me of my sin and makes me Yours. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 54 The Lord Upholds My Life

While most of the psalms are written in response to a particular historical event (cf. Psalm 51), they are also composed in such a way that they become "everyman's psalm." Psalm 54 is a prayer for rescue and vindication. The psalm ist prays for God to deliver him from the attacks of his enemies. The enemies of God, His Gospel in Christ Jesus and His people are manifold. Let this prayer be your prayer when the godless and ruthless attack you. Know that the Lord God is indeed your "helper" and the One who upholds your life (v.4). Remember that Christ Jesus faced all your enemies head on and God vindicated Him on the third day so that you could look in triumph over them. *Thank You, Lord Jesus, for defeating all my enemies that I may live in Your victory. Amen.*
