Around the Word Devotions + the week of October 17-23, 2021

THEME OF THE WEEK: Resisting the Flesh at Home in the World

The flesh is frighteningly powerful in its urges, fixations, and obsessions. It desires men's praise. It desires our neighbor's wildly successful career, spouse, and vacation home. Most often, the flesh wants to indulge itself in sloth because of its bored indifference with all things good and sacred. When our passions run wild through our hearts, our desires become chains that enslave our every waking moment. The flesh is never sated. It always demands more. How can we be set free? The Lord contends against the flesh with his Holy Spirit. He creates new hearts within us. He crucifies our flesh and teaches us to resist with prayer in Jesus' name.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 22:1-14 "Called and Chosen"

You're invited to the wedding feast for Christ and His Church. Others have been invited. Instead of rejoicing at the invitation, they went back to work at their farms and businesses. Some were so offended by the invitation that they seized and killed the messengers. Don't despise the invitation when it comes, dear Saints. Seize hold of the summons to eat at the Son's table with faith and joy. You don't deserve to be invited. Neither do your concerns over farms and businesses compare to what awaits you in the Father's house. Put on the wedding garment of baptism and faith. Go to church every week and feast on the

body and blood of your Lord. Rejoice! You have been called and chosen for eternal life. *Grant me joy in Your house, O Lord. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Luke 10:1-9 "The Harvest and Its Laborers"

The Lord's messengers have a hard task. Instead of worrying about money, food, and other supplies, Jesus commands them to "carry no moneybag, no knapsack, no sandals, and greet no one on the road." How are they going to eat? What will they wear? Before the Lord's messengers proclaim, "The Kingdom of God has come near you," they themselves must trust in the Lord's mercy. Jesus' messengers aren't mercenaries. They're not in it for the money. They proclaim the joy they themselves know from being forgiven by Jesus' saving blood. Pray for your pastor. Make sure his needs are supplied. Tell him to abandon worry and trust in the Lord who provides. *Grant my pastor faith to preach the Gospel without fearing this world. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 5:15-21 "The Days Are Evil"

The devil wants you to obsess over missing out on the world's pleasures and joys. The unbelievers, the devil argues, are having fun. "They have friends. They're never bothered by a guilty conscience since there's no God, sin, or judgment. So why not indulge the flesh?" This is folly. Do you think the unbelievers know a moment of peace in their consciences? Do you think their souls have found rest in their flesh? Make wise use of your time. Flee from the devil's temptations. Fill yourself with the Holy Spirit by hearing the Word at church. Take time to study your Bible. Pray often with thanksgiving. Submit to your neighbors out of reverence for Christ. O Lord, grant me to sojourn in this world with hope in the world to come. Amen.

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SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 65:1, 2 "Setting Our Own Tables"

The Lord sends His messengers into our churches and homes. By written invitation and through their pleading voices the Lord lays bare His heart. He wants to bless us. He wants to invite us into His own house as if we are members of His holy family. Despite the heartfelt entities, our flesh prefers to set its tables in honor of self-earned Fortune and self-wrought Destiny (vs. 11). God be praised that His messengers bear not only gentle invitations, but stern warnings against rejecting the Lord's generosity. Tables made in our own honor or in the honor of false gods dishonors the Lord. It brings wrath and judgment. Be

warned. Fear God. Seek favor in the Lord's eyes through His Son's sacrifice. O Lord, shelter me in Your courts for Christ's sake. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 21:28-44 "Doing the Will of the Father"

Both parables were spoken to the hard-hearted Pharisees, scribes, Sadducees, and members of the Sanhedrin during Holy Week as they were plotting to take Jesus' life. As Abraham's descendants, they had inherited the promises of Jesus' coming. But they hardened their hearts against Him and despised His Word. What the religious experts wouldn't receive, the tax collectors and prostitutes received with joy. Jesus didn't come to affirm their sins. He came to forgive them and to renew their hearts with the gifts of His Spirit. They, along with the Gentiles, are the "other tenants" that will be entrusted with the Lord's vineyard and will be welcomed into God's kingdom. Give us repentant hearts, O Lord, that cling to Jesus alone for salvation. Amen.



SCRIPTURE: Romans 11:25-32 "Beloved for the Sake of their Forefathers"

Though many Gentiles welcomed the Gospel with open hearts, many of the Jews would not accept that Jesus is their Messiah, the Holy One of Israel Who made atonement for the sin of the whole world. What becomes of the many promises of blessing given to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob? What becomes of their calling to be God's own people? Their unfaithfulness does not nullify God's favor. When they hear and believe, God's favor rests upon them. Do not think this text confirms millenialistic ideas about a last-minute, mass conversion of the Jews. Rather it promises that as the Gentiles are being brought into salvation, so are a number of the Israelites. O Lord, give Your Word power to work repentance and faith among both Jews and Gentiles. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 57 "For in You My Soul Takes Refuge"

Using your Bible's cross reference, you'll discover the context is from David's flight to escape Saul in the cave of Adullam in 1 Samuel 22. The Holy Spirit has recorded David's prayer as a model for your own prayers in times of distress. See how quickly David casts himself on the Lord's mercy! Isn't he worried that the Lord holds some sin against him? Isn't he worried that the Lord won't hear him? Not at all. He is certain of the Lord's kindness. The Lord has promised him great things. The Lord doesn't lie. You also should trust in what the Lord has spoken to you. Jesus died for you. You are God's own child. God will bless you in this world and give you eternal life in the world to come. Be exalted, O God, above the heavens! Amen.

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
