THEME OF THE WEEK: Humble Love of Brothers in Faith

SCRIPTURE: Luke 14:1-11 - A Sabbath Healing

"Is it lawful to heal on the Sabbath?" The Lord reminds us that if we live by the law we will die by the law. The law indeed is holy and righteous and good. It indeed points out our sin and points us to godly living. But it is nonetheless incapable of saving us. Because of our inability to keep it in its perfection, we cannot thereby attain its promises. And through Him we are healed, every day, but especially on the Sabbath, when we come to the Lord's House and rest in Him and His forgiveness through His Word and His Gifts. SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:129-136 (PE) - Illuminated Darkness

Yet, in the midst of this deep darkness we have a light to guide our way through the gloom and into the brightness of the resurrection and eternal life. This light is the Lord's Word. SCRIPTURE: **Ephesians 4:1-6 – One Voice Among Many**

This is our Lord's exhortation to us in the midst of a world filled with many voices, many paths, many ways to live, many faiths. SCRIPTURE: Matthew 18:1-11 - An Angelic Guard

The Lord promises that He will guard His dear children. He will protect them from the schemes and assaults of the devil and his angels. He will take them from this veil of sorrows to Himself and then raise them on the day of resurrection. And the chief way He protects our children and all Christians is through His Word. Jesus' words create and sustain our faith. We become like the children brought to Jesus, to whom He says belongs the kingdom of Heaven. But the Lord also appoints angels to guard us in this life. And so, we rejoice to feast, not fast, every time we gather with the Saints, as we look forward to the eternal banquet to come. Lord Jesus, grant that I would always rejoice to be a guest at Your table. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Jude 20-25 - Not Left up to Us

Luther wrote a marvelous prayer which many pastors pray, known as the "sacristy prayer". One of the notes he makes is that "if everything were left up to me I would have ruined it long ago." And this is true for not just pastors called to shepherd the Lord's Church, but also all Christians. If it were left up to us we would be constantly stumbling. We would present ourselves before God with all the blame of our sin. But the Lord keeps us from stumbling into unbelief and He, by His blood, presents us to the Father as being blameless. In Him we are declared righteous, even as He is righteous. Blessed Lord, keep me from stumbling into unbelief through the foreiveness of sins in Christ. Amen.

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 56 - Unafraid of Man

"In God I trust; I shall not be afraid. What can man do to me?" We are always tempted to fear the retribution of man. There is temptation to fear our reputation, our property, our families, or our lives being taken from us. We fear the anger of our neighbor or coworker or family member. But David reminds us that our trust, being placed in God, means that we not only do not fear, but that man can, in fact, do nothing to us. The Lord has delivered our soul from death and we will walk before God in the light of life. We will, on the last day, be raised eternally with every good and perfect gift, with death defeated, and with the unending presence of God. Lord, keep me from the fear of man, and help me ever to put my trust, fear, and love, only in You. Amen.
