Around the Word Devotions + the week of August 20-26, 2017

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Worship of God Wrought by the Spirit

To worship God is to come into His presence and receive the gifts that He bestows. The response to those gifts is to acknowledge where they have come from, thank Him for what He gives, sing His Word back to Him, and pray. Man lives by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord (Deuteronomy 8:3) so we find our life in the hearing of God's Word. Worship should be the pinnacle of our days and weeks because we are receiving the gifts that give life. Let us come into His presence with thanksgiving and receive all that the Lord loves to give.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 19:41-48 Preparing for the Visit

People will go to great lengths to prepare their home for someone's impending visit. The nooks and crannies get dusted and all the things get picked up so the house looks presentable. Jesus weeps that many of the people of Jerusalem were not ready for the visit of the Son of God. John the Baptist had prepared people for the visit of Jesus by preaching God's Word and not all would listen. Jesus had come to Jerusalem to lay down His life for the sheep and He comes to you today with His Word so that His sacrifice is applied to you. The Lord has come to visit you so be ready to hear His Word of kindness and mercy.

Dear Spirit, open my ears to hear the Word of the Lord. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:73-80 Given Understanding

As we listen to the Word of God, the gift of understanding is a way that God blesses us. As we are attentive to listening, the Holy Spirit opens our mind to understand what God has to say. At least partially, worship is an intellectual exercise. God uses language to communicate. Thus, to worship is to understand the language He uses and thereby be edified by it as His mercy comes to us. We use language in turn to pray, praise, and give thanks. *Merciful Lord, give me understanding so that I may sing Your praises. Amen.*

SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 12:1-11 Spirit Driven Worship

You may be tempted to think that God needs you to worship Him and to worship God is a work that begins with you. The reading today shows that the Spirit is what causes you to be able to say, "Jesus is Lord." You can say this because you have faith in Jesus Christ. In addition, this faith will drive you to receive the gifts of God in worship. God doesn't need your worship; you need the gifts he bestows on you in worship. Driven by the Holy Spirit, you come into the presence of God and have all that you need from His gracious hand. *Holy Spirit, open my mouth to confess the name of Jesus. Amen.*





SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 7:1-7 The Building! The Building!

For a congregation with a large sanctuary and facility there is a temptation among the people to idolize the building and put too great of an emphasis on it. For congregations with a small sanctuary and very little in the way of permanent facilities there is a temptation to covet what they don't have and just assume that building a structure will cause people to come to church. Jeremiah speaks against the people and tells them that trust in buildings (the temple of the Lord) is sinful. Trust in the Lord not the work of your hands. It is the body of Jesus, turn down on the cross and built up three days later, that gives us the confidence of God's love. Lord, thank You for the place where I receive Your bountiful gifts. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 22:24-30 Confessing Jesus

Today the church remembers Bartholomew (also called Nathaniel), one of the twelve disciples. Upon meeting Jesus, Bartholomew called Jesus the Son of God, the King of Israel. One aspect of worship is to confess what you believe. As we say the Creeds in church we join Bartholomew and tell God and others what we believe about the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. One reason we do this in worship is so that we will be prepared to give a reason for the hope that is within us when the time comes. SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 3:7-15 Mutual Exhortation

The Christian is placed into a community of believers in the local congregation. In this small assembly of believers there is a glimpse given of the gathering of all God's Saints in the resurrection on the Last Day. The community of believers gathers together for worship. Also, in knowing one another you have the opportunity to exhort one another. This means to encourage each other in faith, to guide others away from the deceitfulness of sin and the hardening of heart to bless one another, and to rejoice together in the love of Christ. Holy Spirit, let me be encouraged and strengthened in faith by the words of my fellow believers. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 143 Fleeing to the Lord

The Psalmist David says that he has fled "to the Lord for refuge." The Lord is your refuge in time of trouble and when sin and the devil assail you. You flee to Him, and find Him in His Word and in the Sacrament of the Altar. In Him you find protection and sanctuary. He delivers you from your enemies and is the mighty fortress that surrounds you. Tomorrow as you attend church, be reminded that the Lord surrounds you and gives you the safety of His love. *Lord, I flee to You for refuge, deliver me from my enemies. Amen.*

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
