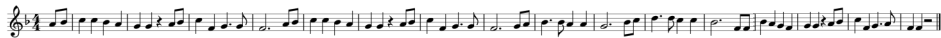
8 PRAY THE PRAYER OF THE WEEK

Around the Word Devotions + the week of August 30-September 5, 2020

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Hearing and Speaking Wrought by the Spirit

The Creator uses His creation for His purposes of life and salvation for the sinner. He is not a divine watchmaker who wound up creation and leaves it to itself. Rather, He sent His Son, born of woman, to suffer, to die upon the cross, and to rise again to restore His creation. He sends the Holy Spirit with that recreating Word of the cross to open our ears to faith. He opens our eyes to see that creation has a Creator Who loves us and gives us all that we need “to support this body and life.” These gifts are not the ends in themselves, but the means.

The ends having ears opened, tongues loosed and eyes that see Him in His glory in eternity.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Mark 7:31-37 Ears Opened and Tongues Loosed

Luther uses our Gospel today to talk about Infant Baptism. Here, in this deaf man, we see an example of what happens in the Sacrament. The Church brings infants who cannot come to the Lord by themselves. Babies don't have the strength to present themselves. So, just like the man in our reading, infants are carried to Jesus to be embraced by our Lord. He places His fingers in their ears to hear His Word. He cries “Ephphatha”. He looses their tongues to sing His praises. Jesus does all things well, even opening your ears to hear and your tongue to rejoice in His salvation. *Lord, keep our ears open to hear Your Word and our tongues able to sing Your praise. Amen.*

MON

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:89-96 (LAMEDH) The Word exceeds Creation's Limits

“Forever, O Lord, Your Word is firmly fixed in the heavens.” Forever. The Word is everlasting, like the heavens. It endures for generations. This is the creative Word which governs all that it makes. This is a Word which also gives life. It gave life to the Psalmist, who rejoices in it. We, likewise, rejoice because God uses this Word to preserve our lives. There are no limits to this Word. Creation has limits put in place by God. This Word which the Spirit uses to give life is unparalleled in its broadness. *Lord, help us to rejoice in this Word which the Spirit uses for our salvation. Amen.*

TUE

SCRIPTURE: 2 Corinthians 3:4-11 The Word is our Confidence

The Spirit gives life. It is the Spirit who opens our ears to hear the Word, which declares our salvation and relies not upon ourselves but upon Jesus. The Spirit gives us faith in Jesus Who fulfilled the Law in His perfect life and sacrificial death upon the cross. This is our confidence: that Jesus' death is for me. His resurrection is for me. We have confidence in this because the Word has been declared to us. In that confidence, our glory does not fade because we have the Word which gives life. *Lord, help us rejoice in Your Word, our confidence. Amen.*

WED

SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 29:18, 19 The Day of Restoration is Yours

The deaf do not hear stories. The blind live in a world of darkness. Yet, in that day — in the day of Jesus, this is reversed. In Jesus the deaf hear the words of salvation. In Jesus the blind see. In Jesus the poor are exalted. All three receive salvation and are transformed. In the same way the meek and the poor are exalted and rejoice in the Lord. The day has come for you in your baptism. The Holy Spirit opened your ears to the Word, your eyes to the marvelous light of Christ. Exalted, you rejoice.

Lord, keep us in Your restoration. Amen.

THU

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 12:31-42 Sin Against the Spirit

Unbelievers demonstrate their lack of faith by their actions. Christians are also known by their actions. Sinful actions of clogging ears to others' confessions and holding tongues from proclaiming forgiveness. We sin against the Holy Spirit by denying the forgiveness one has received. Denial of forgiveness is to put yourself in the place of the Holy Spirit, judging others' hearts. But Jesus, Who is greater than Solomon, is here. His three days and nights in the earth are your salvation. He proclaims the Words of repentance and uses His members for righteous reasons: ears that hear His Words, tongues that praise His name.

Lord, help us use our ears and tongues righteously. Amen.

FRI

SCRIPTURE: James 3:1-12 Tongues of Flames

The tongue is a fire which cannot be tamed. Either the flames destroy and kill, or they give life and forgiveness and salvation. With the same tongue we destroy with curses and bless with the proclamation of the Word of Life. This little body part causes so much damage to the whole body, leading to destruction in the fires of hell. This should not be so. What is the solution? The Spirit comes to us. He breathes His Word upon us and purifies our tongues with His flaming Pentecost tongues of the Word of Christ crucified.

Lord, purify our tongues to speak Your truth. Amen.

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 104 Creator before Creation

God alone is the Creator. However, without God being revealed to us, we misuse the creation from its lights and clouds to its earthly foundations and mountains. We can even turn the animals, seasons, and other men into god-replacers. In our “original sin” state we worshiped the creation and not the Creator. But the Lord has revealed Himself to us in the Spirit that re-creates us in the Word and Water, opening the gates of heaven where we will “Praise the Lord!” for eternity.

Lord, help us focus upon You, the Creator, above Your creation. Amen.

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
