## Around the Word Devotions + the week of January 12-18, 2020

#### THEME OF THE WEEK: God Manifested in the Youth of Jesus

"Faith comes by hearing, and hearing by the Word of Christ." The Lord Jesus as a boy grew in faith no differently than we did. He was strengthened by the Holy Spirit at work in the Word of God. Unlike us, however, He did not grow for His own benefit, but for our sakes. The Scriptures with their teachings are the source of our life, the foundation of our complaints, the confidence for us and those around us who remain in darkness. The Scriptures reveal who our God is: the Lord of mercy, Who gives His Son into death to atone for our sins. The cate-

chism shows Him to be a God like no other; and He is ours.

#### SUN

#### SCRIPTURE: Luke 2:41-52-Of the Father's Will and Word

"About His Father's house or His Father's business," that is how the boy Jesus' response may be understood. They belong together because the Father's business is revealed in His house, the Temple. It is His wish to make atonement for sinners so that He may meet graciously with them to give His blessing. In Christ, the new Temple made without hands, this will be done once and for all. Here the Son of God learns as we all do from the Holy Scriptures what the will of God is. And His will, business, and the purpose of His house is forgiveness and life. *Lord, let me learn and grow in Your Word. Amen* 

MON

#### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 13—Divine Complaint Department

Will you forget me forever, Lord? How long? These are words of lament. Many people have taught us that we should not question or complain to God. The Psalms teach differently. It is a godly thing to bring prayers of sorrow and even frustration before God. Most everyone enjoys complaining—to everyone but the person whom it concerns. God is the one who can do something about our struggles, especially those deep in body, soul, and mind. Bring your complaint to Him. And add to it faith: *Lord, hear my complaint, strengthen my trust in Your mercy, and restore the joy of Your salvation. Amen.* 

ΓUE

#### SCRIPTURE: Romans 12:1-5—Dumb Without the Scriptures

Even speechless, motionless idols are able to lead astray the darkened pagan mind of sinful humanity. That's how foolish sin makes us. We require the leadership of the Holy Spirit constantly because we cannot be left to ourselves. But where does the Spirit speak? He speaks in the Holy Scriptures. And the Spirit will not, nor can He contradict Himself. The Scriptures must be our touchstone, therefore. They are not mute, but full of the Spirit's truth. Beware anyone who contradicts them, but do not be surprised. *Lord, renew in me Your Holy Spirit and preserve me from the spirit of darkness and idolatry. Amen.*  WED

#### SCRIPTURE: Isaiah 61:1-3—Christ Jesus

In Greek, Christ; in Hebrew, Messiah; in English, Anointed. This title is important because it shows that Jesus has an office, with duties that must be done. In particular, He *proclaims the year of the Lord's favor*, that is, God's grace through His *fulfillment of all righteousness*. We call people "messiahs" in hopes that they live up to the title. God, not us, appointed Jesus. He will live up to His Names. Above all, His name is "Jesus," because He saves His people from their sins. This is His task and office as the Christ for us. *Lord, anoint me with righteousness and gladness to be Your Christian. Amen.* 

### THU

### SCRIPTURE: Mark 10:13-16—Faith Like a Little Child

Jesus (who was a child) loves children. That is a fine posture to imitate. But Jesus wants us also to imitate the faith of a child. Yes, infants and children have faith! They trust in God from the womb and the breast; they believe in Jesus and God wants none of them to be harmed. Faith is not a matter of personal strength and willpower; it is a matter of depending on the One who promises because He is faithful and will surely do it. That is how we enter and receive the Kingdom as an inheritance, whether young or old. *Lord, remove all hindrances from us that we may abide in Your blessing. Amen.* 

#### FRI

#### SCRIPTURE: Ephesians 6:1-4—Take Your Catechism to Heart!

We see the boy Jesus gladly learning His catechism in the Temple. If the Lord must do this, we cannot think ourselves wiser. Parents may teach many lessons for life, but the most important instruction is in *the fear and instruction of the Lord.* The father, so long as there is one, is the head of the household by God's order. And notice for what purpose this is true: not provoking children (or wives) to anger, but to *bring up* and to *teach* the family. Father and mother are to answer their child's good questions, so that the child may also answer in turn. *Give us fathers after Your own heart, Heavenly Father! Amen.*

### SCRIPTURE: Psalm 86—None Like Him Among the gods

The nations the Lord made will come to Him. This was a comfort to Israel who had to fight for survival against many nations; it was comforting to the prophets and to St. Paul because it proclaimed the salvation of the Gentiles that would come in Christ. It remains comforting for us. The whole world is in the Lord's hands and care, not only to preserve it, but also by the Word and His Spirit, to save it in Christ. He has not given up on the heathen yet! His patience is not slow but merciful. He is slow only to anger; He abounds in steadfast love and faithfulness. *Lord, unite my heart to fear Your name. Amen.*
