Around the Word Devotions + the week of January 27-February 2, 2019

THEME OF THE WEEK: God Manifested in the Power of Jesus to Heal

It is the blessed will of God that we are forgiven our sins on account of the blood of Jesus. That forgiveness heals us of our iniquities and purifies us of our sins. Because of that forgiveness we are strengthened daily to walk by faith in our lives and vocations, always asking how we may best serve our neighbor. We continue in this service, until that day when our Lord calls us from this life to await the life to come. And though we may not see in this life the promise of the new heavens and new earth, we will see it on the Last Day when we will be raised from the dead for eternity.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 8:1-13 - God's Will to Cleanse Us

A leper came to Jesus asking if it was Jesus' will to cleanse him. Jesus responded, "I will, be clean." And He gives to us that same word. Except, instead of coming before the Lord as a leper, we come before Him worse, as a sinner, as an enemy of God, as one deserving eternal death. We may be tempted to ask if it is God's will to cleanse us also, but we need not ask. We need only to look at the cross. We need only look at Jesus' death for our sake. He prays before His crucifixion "Father, not Mine, but Your will be done." And that will is that He die for our sake. And in that dying, we are cleansed from our sin. *Lord Jesus, thank*

You for Your will to forgive my sins. Help me always to trust that Your will is for my good. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 15 – Living Faithfully Under the Lord

The Lord promises that those who are to dwell with Him are to live by faith. By faith we live our lives. By faith we are called righteous. By faith we do and speak the truth. By faith we look to the needs of our neighbor. We guard and protect their reputation and name. We forgive them when they sin against us. We rejoice and uphold those who also confess the faith. We deal fairly with our neighbor and we protect the innocent. And as we live in this manner, as we live by faith, we are promised that no matter how hard the world and the devil fight against us, we will stand safe, and secure, and strong, because God preserves and protects us. Blessed Lord, may I always be faithful to Your Word, and never doubt Your promises. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Romans 12:16-21 b - Overcoming Evil by Forgiving

When we are sinned against, the great temptation is to justify our sinning in response. When someone does us wrong, we want to do wrong back because we believe they deserve it. But St. Paul reminds us this is not the way to act. "Do not be overcome by evil, but overcome evil with good." We respond to being sinned against by praying and forgiving. Our example for this is how the Lord Himself deals with our sins. He does not hold our sins against us. He does not repay us with evil. He repays us with His own blood. He overcomes our evil with the good of His death and resurrection. Heavenly Father, keep me from seeking retaliation against my enemies, but instead, to forgive as You have forgiven me. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Jeremiah 33:6-9 – Healed by Forgiveness

The Lord promises to bring health and healing. We hear this and we get both excited and confused. Excited because, who doesn't want health and healing? Confused because, who of us knows a world devoid of those things. But what we fail to recognize are two things. First, that the healing promised is what is spoken of in verse 8, to be cleansed from our guilt. To be forgiven of our sins. Second, that the final removal of our ailments, the final fulfilment of health and healing, is when our Lord raises our bodies on the Last Day. Then we will have no more sickness, as well as no more sin, and that will last for eternity. Lord Jesus, thank You for Your forgiveness and promise to raise me healed on the

Last Day. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 17:5-10 - Faith Makes No Demands

The apostles pray for increased faith. What Jesus says in response is striking. He says at the end that increased faith results in faithful living. And that we in the end get no credit for that faithfulness. We must confess at the last that we're only doing what we're supposed to be doing. But that is the response of faith. It doesn't ask what I get out of my good works, but asks, "how may I serve my neighbor?" Faith doesn't demand to get credit for our works, but instead confesses, "to God alone be glory." And the reason for this is because faith also believes and trusts God's promises, especially the forgiveness of sins. *Heavenly*

Father, help me to always, by faith, serve my neighbors in my vocations. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 11:1-16 - Faith Believes What Is Unseen

When we begin construction on a building, we are disappointed if we don't see its completion. When we teach our children, we fear that we will not live long enough to see the results. For the saints from Adam to the offspring of Abraham, they were given the promise of a new home. None of them saw it, but they trusted the promise. They lived by faith. So too, do we. We're given the great promise of the resurrection. A home in the new heavens and new earth. A glorified body. But most will not see it in their life, but will have to wait for the life of the world to come. We live by faith, not by sight. Lord, bless us with unwavering faith in Your promise of the blessed resurrection from the dead. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 2:22-32 - Purified by Blood

Mary came to the temple to be purified. It was required by the Law. But also required by the Law was the presentation of the first born. And so Jesus was presented to the Lord. Right after His birth, Jesus begins His lifelong fulfilment of the Law. Mary had to, for herself. Jesus also had to, but not for His own holiness, but for the holiness of us, His dear children. And having fulfilled the Law in all its parts, having kept every aspect of it from His birth, Jesus goes to the cross as the one of whom Simeon speaks: salvation, light, and glory. And having shed His blood, we, like Mary, are purified from our sins. Blessed Lord, thank You for purifying me by Your blood, grant me a steadfast faith and trust in all You have done for my salvation. Amen.
