Around the Word Devotions + the week of June 28-July 4, 2020

THEME OF THE WEEK: The Repentance Wrought by the Spirit

What was lost is found. Sheep. Coins. Sinners called to repentance and faith in our Lord, Jesus. Once found, Jesus does not leave those who are His. He stands beside us. He sends the Holy Spirit to see us through trials and temptations, placing us upon firm ground. This begins in our baptism where our sins are drowned like Pharaoh and his host in the sea. There, at the font, the Holy Spirit comes upon each of us individually and by name. God cleanses us and makes us children. He loosens the unbelieving scales from our eyes to see Jesus as He is for us. With the Holy Spirit working repentance and faith in us, we leap for joy in the presence of our Lord, knowing that He forgives us for all our sins that we have been committing since our youth.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: Luke 15:1-10 Angels Rejoice

Can you hear it? Heaven is rejoicing. Angels and archangels are leading the celebration. Jesus has found another lost and wandering sheep. Jesus has swept His house clean and found another coin lost in the corner. He wants to rejoice. So the angels and archangels rejoice. They rejoiced when you were found. They rejoice when every sinner is found. They rejoice when someone repents. They rejoice when the Absolution is declared, when the lavish flood of baptism is washed upon a sinner, when Christ's body and blood are received in repentance and faith. *Lord, help us repent. Amen.*



SCRIPTURE: Matthew 16:13-20 Faith Revealed

Caesarea Philippi was built on the location where the northern king Jeroboam led Israel into idolatry. Later, there were several pagan temples there, including one to Pan. Pan was regarded as a giver of revelations. Yet, in our reading, Pan is useless when it comes to knowing who Jesus is. Jesus is, as St. Peter declares, the "Christ, the Son of the Living God." Peter and Paul needed this truth revealed to them. It has also been revealed to you. The Holy Spirit has called you by the Gospel to believe that Jesus is your Lord. Thank You for revealing to us that Jesus is our Lord. Amen.



SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 5:6-11 Endure Your Sufferings

The devil, our ancient foe, is prowling around like a lion trying to devour us. But have no fear little flock. You do not stand alone against the devil. The Holy Spirit is with you. He has called you in the waters of Baptism. He has brought you to repentance and faith by the Gospel of Christ crucified. Through trials and temptations, He increases your faith. He places you on firm ground, making it so you can endure your sufferings and resist the devil's temptations. Lord, teach us to call upon You for help in our suffering. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Micah 7:18-20 God is Love and Compassion

What makes God different from all the man-made deities? According to the prophet Micah, He "pardons iniquity," "passes over iniquity," and "delights in steadfast love." We have a God of love and compassion. Man-made deities are anything except loving and compassionate. God, out of love and compassion, has called us by name in Baptism where He "cast[s] all our sins into the depths of the sea." With our sins forgiven, we are set free by the power of the Holy Spirit to repent of our sins knowing what His love looks like: Jesus sacrificed for our sin and His empty tomb. Lord, keep us in Your steadfast love. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Luke 1:39-56 Holy Spirit Causes Leaping In the Womb

The angel appeared to Zechariah while working in the Temple. He was to have a child. He did not believe the Lord's promise, and so he became mute until the baby's birth. Fast forward a couple months and Elizabeth confesses that the baby in the womb of Mary is the Lord. This is the knowledge that can only come from the Holy Spirit. And top it off, filled with the Holy Spirit, John announces his Lord's appearance in the flesh by leaping in the womb of his mother, Elizabeth. What else is there to do but sing and rejoice in knowing that this Child is the Lord? Lord, help us to rejoice like John, leaping in joy at the sound of Your Word. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Acts 9:1-18 Paul Brought to Repentance

Saul was a killer and persecutor of the church. He encouraged stoning because of the sinful and greedy demands of his heart. He believed that he was on the side of the angels. He was the one in the right because those belonging to the Way deserved to die. Because of his spiritual blindness he was blinded physically by God. The Lord converted him and brought him to repentance, to see what he had done. The Lord opened the eyes of his once dead soul to see what he couldn't before: Jesus the Christ is his merciful Lord and Redeemer. Into this faith he was baptized. You too were once blinded by sin. Now, by baptism, your eyes are opened. You walk in His marvelous light. Lord, remove the scales

SAT

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 25 A Psalm of Help and Forgiveness

The Psalmist does not gloss over his youth and past sinful indiscretions. Rather, he admits, he confesses that sins have been his companion and guide. He needs forgiveness. He repents and relies upon the mercies of God, "for Your name's sake." He prays, "O Lord, pardon all my guilt, for it is great." The Lord does this in the perfectly atoning death of Jesus. The minister declares this forgiveness to you, washes it over you, and feeds it to you in the Lord's Supper, so that you may walk in the love and truth of the Lord.
