THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered All the Penalties of Human Sin

Holy Week, it has all come down to this: Thirty-three years of doing the will of the Father for you; thirty-three years of overcoming temptations for you; thirtythree years of proclaiming the Gospel for you; thirty-three years of fulfilling the Law for you. He has done it all, accomplished it all; well almost all. The sin of the world is laid upon His perfect shoulders. He has carried them to Jerusalem; with His face always turned toward the cross. He will not forsake it, not now. This is His purpose: To suffer as a perfect sacrifice all the penalties of your sin and mine. He will be betrayed. He will be beaten and tortured. His disciples will

flee. The Lamb will remain silent. The Father will forsake Him. He will die and be placed in a tomb. And it is all for you!

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 21:1-9-Lord Save Us Now ...

Jesus comes riding into Jerusalem like a king; a new and greater Solomon. But His reign will not be a peaceful one; for you it will be, but not for Him. His throne will be a cross, His royal crest bloody wounds and bruises. No ring upon His finger only a nail through His hand. 'Lord, I will lay down my life for you." The arrogant words of an arrogant man. These are words that we all wish we would have the courage to say. But Peter had it wrong, and so do we. The Lord needs nothing from us, requires nothing from us. The sacrifice is not ours to give, but ours to receive. The dress of a sinner exchanged for the dress of a righteous God! There is nothing more that needs to be done. It is finished; all of it. Your sins clothing Christ. His righteousness clothing you! —*Hosanna to the Son of David! Blessed is He who comes*



SCRIPTURE: Matthew 27:57-66—Jesus Dead In The Tomb...

Jesus rests in the tomb. His work is finished. Today He sanctifies the grave. Tomorrow He will claim victory over it. This is the promise for you. Where is death's victory? Where is death's sting? It is gone! It is buried deep in the ground with Jesus never to rise again. But Jesus will; He did. And so will you. This is your assurance: that God will keep your bodies in peaceful sleep until He comes again in glory. The stone will be rolled away; it has been.
