Around the Word Devotions + the week of March 18-24, 2018

THEME OF THE WEEK: He Suffered the Enmity of Unbelievers

God saves not by giving us power or wealth, but by dying on the cross. This is not for the worthy but for sinners. It's for you. It's a scandalous message, yet the hope of all who trust in Him. We find our victory in His defeat, our strength in His weakness, and our courage in His promises. Lent fixes the cross before our eyes, not simply that we would be sad, but that we would be honest about our sin and the death that it yields, and then find an answer in what Christ has done for us. He pours forth the gifts won by His blood in His temple, that we who gather would find forgiveness, life, and salvation.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: John 8:46-59 Jesus isn't just old. He's God.

I have the same problem as the Jews. I can't get over the fact that Abraham died. I see pain and suffering and death. Jesus promised we would never taste death if we believe in Him, but the prophets died. "Who do you make yourself out to be" is a fair question. Before Abraham was, I AM. They don't get mad because Jesus says He's old, but because Jesus says He's God. I AM. YAHWEH. The God who saved Abraham from death. The God who will die to destroy death that we will never taste it.

Lord God, even as You saved Abraham from death that He might rejoice in the day of Your salvation, fix our eyes upon the cross that we might receive the same. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 54 Tense Matters

Selah. Rest. David takes a breath and the whole Psalm changes. O God, ruthless men seek my life. Present tense. Selah. Rest. God is my helper. He has delivered me from every trouble, and my eye has looked in triumph on my enemies. Perfect tense. A past event with present implication. He has saved me and even now I am saved, even while strangers rise against me. God has already worked your salvation. Christ has been crucified that you are even now saved from sin, death, and the power of the devil. Selah. Rest. Take a breath.

O God, as You have worked our salvation of old, rescue us from every present need of body and soul. Amen.

TUE

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 9:11-15 God Died for You

God died for you. The Son stood before the Father and bled for you. In a world where the conscience is constantly assaulted, this is where we stand. The High Priest offered up holy and precious blood that we would be redeemed. Of all the things that we do to deaden guilty consciences, Christ makes it alive by dying Himself. You are holy. Not because of dead works you do, but because of the blood of Christ. Be honest with your conscience. It doesn't need to die. God died for you. Nothing you've done can change it.

Heavenly Father, look to the all availing sacrifice of Your Son that we who You have called would be received into Your Kingdom by His merit and grant us clean consciences in the same. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Genesis 12:1-3 More than a Dynasty

God made a great nation from one man by putting His own Son into the picture through the lineage of Abram to die, and thus conquer sin and death forever. This is no dynasty. This is the lineage of salvation. Christ Jesus was sent into the world through the seed of Abram to make him into a blessing, that we, under the weight of sin, would be rescued and brought through death to life. To look to Abram's lineage is to look to Jesus and find blessing, and to curse this lineage is to curse God Himself.

Heavenly Father, You have made us Yours through Abram's Seed. Even as we receive this blessing through His blood, let us rejoice in the promise made to Abram and to us. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 10:32-42 Crosses Hurt, but they Save.

Christianity is a sword that cuts through families. It isn't personal. Their real problem isn't with you, but with God. That doesn't make it easier. Especially when the 4th Commandment tells us to honor our parents, to raise up our children in faith. We cannot despise them, yet whoever loves these more than God is unworthy. Our hope is not navigating the eggshells and landmines. Hope in God. The Father set Himself against His own Son to redeem sinners, you and your family alike. He bears your cross for you. Be near that cross. Crosses hurt, but they save too.

SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 1:21-31 Same Thing Every Week.

Christ crucified for sinners. Every week. Some get tired of it. No signs. Little wisdom. Feels like there should be more. Signs. Wisdom. We imagine how full the church would be if the pastor actually healed the sick. If he wasn't so awkward. Paul could have given it. He was brilliant, did miracles, yet he only wants to preach Christ for their forgiveness. We do miracles here, just not the signs the world is looking for. We see Jesus. Body and blood truly present to forgive your sins in mercy and love. This is the power and wisdom of God for you. Lord, show Your wisdom in preaching Christ crucified to sinners, who became our redemption that we may boast in You. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 27 God's Temple is a Place of Shelter for You

The shelter that we're so desperate for is given to us in God's temple. In Word and in Sacrament, God grants a life that our enemies cannot take from us. The devil, the world, and our own sinful flesh are undone in the mercy of the Cross. In the Supper we are concealed under His tent. We find joy in His shelter and presence. We don't measure God's absence by the presence of enemies, but by His promises that deliver victory over them. Looking to God's promises, we wait for the Lord, full of courage.

Forsake us not, O God of our salvation. Show us Your steadfast love, that we may find joy in Your salvation. Amen.

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
