Around the Word Devotions + the week of May 28-June 3, 2017

THEME OF THE WEEK: He Ascended to Bless His People

Christ's Ascension into heaven begins the absence of His visible form among men, but the beginning of His dwelling among men through the work of the Holy Spirit. He promised the disciples He would send the Holy Spirit, who came and inspired the apostles not only to preach and teach, but also to write the Gospel. Through the Holy Spirit, Jesus removes our hard hearts and gives us new hearts of flesh that are united around the Truth of God's Word. Finally, our Ascended Lord intercedes for us so we have nothing to fear but give Him heartfelt thanks and praise.

SUN

SCRIPTURE: John 15:26-16:4 — Helper Comes to Bear Witness

Jesus ascends to heaven to send the Holy Spirit, the Helper. He sends the Holy Spirit to deliver real help in times of need. For the apostles, this help would consist of making the good confession about who Christ is and what He did for mankind. The Holy Spirit also inspired the words of these apostles and Gospel writers so that He might also be a helper to you. For you have this Holy Spirit inspired Word, so that when it comes time to speak of the hope you have, when it comes time to face persecution and trial, when men revile you on account of Christ's name, you have a word—the Word—to speak. Heavenly Father, thank you for sending the Holy Spirit and grant us courage to confess you before the world. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 93 — Jesus Reigns

The old ditty says, "He's got the whole world, in His hands . . ." As annoying as the ditty can be, it's true. What's remarkable, however, is that the entire universe sits in the hands of a man—the God-man—Jesus. The Psalmist praises the Lord who established the earth, from everlasting. Mightier than the floods that once ravaged the entire earth, Jesus stands a Lord over all creation. And He does so for the benefit of His people. He stands established forever that His promises and decrees might be trusted to the end of time. And the decree is this: You are His child, washed in the flood of Baptism. Mightier than any sea. Heavenly Father, defend us against every danger of body and soul, and bring us at last to Your everlasting kingdom. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Acts 2:1-13 — A Promise Fulfilled

In Genesis, God confused the language of mankind because they sought to make a name for themselves. On Pentecost, God undoes Babel and gives to mankind by His Spirit a new language: the Gospel. Jesus promised to send the Holy Spirit who would remind the apostles of everything Jesus had taught. On Pentecost, Jesus fulfills His promise. The Holy Spirit comes and inspires the apostles to preach and teach and write the Gospel. This gospel has united Christians all over the world in one language and tongue, giving all thanks and praise to God for what Christ has done for us. Ascended Lord Jesus, we give you thanks for sending to the Holy Spirit to Your apostles that they might write preach, proclaim, and write the blessed Gospel for us. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Ezekiel 36:25-27 — The "Mini Pentecost"

God promised that He would bring new life to the people of Israel. The ancient people were stubborn and hard-hearted. God had to make Ezekiel's forehead "as hard as flint" in order to warn them; Ezekiel means, "He hardens." Ezekiel's hard forehead reflected the hard hearts of the people who continues to worship the false gods on the high places. Just like us, they were incapable of saving themselves. And so, God promised to save them by removing their stone hearts and giving them hearts of flesh; by sprinkling them clean with water. So also God does for us in the "mini Pentecost" of Baptism, wherein He sends His Holy

Spirit to dwell in us. Father, thank you for sending your Spirit into our hearts and washing us clean by Water and Word. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: John 17:20-26 — United by the Holy Spirit

Numerous well-meaning Christians have sought to create a united Christians church on earth. Large conferences all throughout the 20th century were aimed at creating one, visible, united Christian church to fulfill the prayer of Jesus "that they may all be one." Such attempts will always fail, for unity is not created but given. Jesus ascended to heaven and sent the Holy Spirit to unite the church. All who cling in faithfulness to Jesus Christ alone are already united in the Truth. For thus Jesus also prayed, "that they may be sanctified in truth." For the unity brought by the Holy Spirit only exists around the Truth of Christ.

Father, send Your Holy Spirit upon Your Church, that she might be united in the Truth. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Romans 8:29-39 — He Intercedes For Us

who for our sake died and was raised. Amen.

The passage provides much comfort for God's children: we have nothing to fear. When we look at our sinful lives, we of course have much to fear—not from the elements, but from He who created the heavens and the earth. The great comfort of this passage is not simply that we have nothing in all creation to fear, but that the Son of God, who died and was raised by God, intercedes for us in heaven. He ascended to heaven that He might stand as the mediator between the wrath of God and sinful humanity. Tribulation and persecution and famine etc. might come, but they cannot harm us. God's Son intercedes for us. Forgiving Father, we praise You for not looking at our sin, but through Christ Jesus.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 97 — The Earth Rejoices in the Ascended Lord

The creation continues to groan under the pains of sin; the earth still melts in fear before Him and the earth trembles. And yet, despite the fearful world, the children of Zion rejoice. The ascended Lord not only hates evil, but He has conquered it. He preserves His saints. And the whole earth will one day rejoice with them to see the Lord's return. In the meantime, the earth and the children of Zion face the daily struggle against the world with hope and joy, for the end has already been decided, the victory already won. The wicked will pass away, but the righteous who rejoice in the Lord will be delivered. *O Lord, we rejoice in Your salvation and give thanks for Your holy name. Amen.*
