Around the Word Devotions + the week of May 5-11, 2019

THEME OF THE WEEK: He is Risen to Be the Shepherd of the Church

He is risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia! This week is Good Shepherd week. We see how Jesus cares for His sheep. We are His sheep. We were wanderers — lost and confused. He has sought us out and put us in His pastures of green grass and still streams. He lays down His life to keep us safe. He battles our spiritual enemies on our behalf. By His death upon the cross we have life and will dwell in the house of the Lord where we receive His gifts and hear His voice in His Word and Sacraments of Holy Baptism, Holy Communion, and Holy Absolution.

SCRIPTURE: John 10:11-16 Jesus' Flock

Who belongs to God's flock? Is it only the people of Jewish descent? No. Jesus is the Good Shepherd and His flock is international. Faith in His death and resurrection makes one part of this flock. Jesus gathers in people from all nations by His voice. We hear and recognize His voice because it is the voice of the One who cries out on the cross drawing us to Himself. He lays down His life for us. He has called us by name in Holy Baptism. He gives us the fruit of His sacrifice in His body and blood on the Altar. O Lord, thank You for making us and keeping us a part of Your flock. Amen.



SCRIPTURE: Psalm 70 Afflictions

God uses the very things that we struggle against as a way to draw us closer to Himself. We are praying with the psalmist to God for help in the face of afflictions. We cannot stand before them or overcome them. They afflict us, but the effect of the afflictions are the opposite of what was intended by the perpetrators. Our Shepherd alone can help us. He guards and protects us. When He does, our fellow believers rejoice. We also pray that those afflicting us may be drawn to God in repentance and faith. O Lord, we ask You to please continue to stand for us and protect us. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: 1 Peter 2:21-25 Wandering No More

We are by nature wandering and defenseless sheep. To save us, Christ became both Priest and Lamb. He died as a criminal between two criminals. He committed no sin yet was cursed to die on the tree by bearing our sins in His body. Sin caused Jesus' death and damnation. Our Shepherd did all of this to heal us as His sheep. He died to make us righteous. The Shepherd suffered the treatment and bore the cost so we, the sick, could be healed. We are wandering and lost no longer. O Lord, help us to live according to Your Word. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Ezekiel 34:11-16 Our Good Shepherd

The nation of Israel had bad shepherd after bad shepherd. They neglected their duties and the people wandered from faith to faithlessness. The spiritual leaders cared about themselves and not for the sheep of their fold. Their god was themselves. They abandoned their duties and now God will bring Israel to captivity. Yet, in the midst of this, God declares that He will be their Shepherd. He will seek out His sheep, those that have gone astray from the nations. He will gather all His sheep and bring them to Israel and feed them with His own body and blood in good pastures. O Lord, continue to be our Shepherd, and protect us from going astray. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: John 5:22-30 His Judgment is Eternal Life

The Good Shepherd has come to give His life for His sheep. True. He has also come as judge. He declares His judgment to you through His Word that is preached and the Sacraments administered according to His command. When He comes to judge the living and the dead, His judgment on you, His sheep, is one of eternal life that comes from passing from death to life. Those who are His sheep will hear His voice and rejoice for it is a voice that says, "Well done good and faithful servant." O Lord, You are the Good Shepherd, help us to rejoice in our life in You. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Hebrews 13:20, 21 Life and Salvation through His Blood

When God led our Good Shepherd, Jesus, out of death, peace was restored between God and mankind. Jesus was exalted and lifted out of death for us. Jesus burst a hole in the side of death thereby destroying its power. He takes us, His sheep, out the same way He did. He is great and bestows all of His benefits of life and salvation through His blood to us. Jesus has purified us from sin and has delivered us from death. Now we do His will for the benefit of our fellow sheep. O Lord, help us to rejoice in Your benefits. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 23 Still Waters of Baptism

Our Shepherd prayed Psalm 22 while upon the cross. His fulfillment of it in His forsakenness from God so we may be the sheep of His pasture. He suffered and was killed for us. His blood is poured upon us in Baptism. Now we rejoice. Psalm 23 is our response. He died and rose on the third day so we can be resurrected. Only Jesus knows the way through death that leads to life in His pastures of green grass that satisfy the body and soul. He leads us to still waters of Baptism. We are dependent upon Him, our ever-living Head. O Lord, keep us in Your green pastures. Amen.

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
