THEME OF THE WEEK: The Blessedness of the Saints of God

SCRIPTURE: Matthew 5:1-12 "Blessed are you"

Jesus says that you are blessed when others revile you and persecute you falsely on account of Him. He is addressing His disciples and with the use of the word "you," Jesus reaches through the text and addresses the saints of all time yes, even you. He encourages the saints to see that suffering on account of Him is a blessing. To bear the name of Jesus publicly often invites persecution. Rather than be afraid or despair, Jesus calls us to rejoice, "for our reward is great in heaven." The saints before us were persecuted; Jesus was persecuted; and so we can expect persecution, but not without blessing. *Lord Jesus, trusting firmly*

Lord we thank You for preserving us from evil and praise You for Your salvation. Amen.
