# Around the Word Devotions + the week of October 11-17, 2020

### THEME OF THE WEEK: Singlehearted Love of God in Christ

Holy Scripture reminds us of the love that we need. God's love, revealed to us in the person of Jesus Christ, focuses our hearts and minds on Who truly matters, Him. The Father, Jesus Christ, Lord of heaven and earth, Who with the Holy Spirit is one God now and forever, reveals true love at the cross. This love seeks no record of when it has been wronged. He is patient and kind and His love continues even when we forget Him. God is faithful to us, even when we are unfaithful. What a great love God gives to us and gives to others through us. His singlehearted love is the source of all good things. His Son is a perfect picture of His love and our hope and salvation, forever and ever. Amen.

## SCRIPTURE: Matthew 22:34-46 - The Cross of God's Love

Jesus teaches us plainly the greatest commandments in the Law and, surprisingly, they are in the shape of a cross. "Love the Lord your God" is concerned with the first table of the Law, between you and God (vertical). Love your neighbor, with the second table of the law, our service to God via our treatment of our neighbor (horizontal). Everything we say and do, whether prayers or service to God, or love and service to the neighbor happens inside of what Jesus did for us on the vertical and horizontal beams of the cross. His blood silenced the Law's accusation against us. His obedience to the perfect law of love is our gift through faith. Lord Jesus, bless us through Your love as it comes down from heaven and is given to our neighbor through the Word of Your cross and resurrection. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Psalm 119:137-144 - Love the Law, be Blessed by the Gospel

The psalmist loves the Lord in this psalm. He loves the Lord's law and His rules. It is often a temptation to recoil from God's rules because they always condemn us. The law of God brings to us truth. It teaches sinners to recognize and confess their guilt. Yet, the psalmist loves His law, and we should too. How can we love what leads us to guilt? It becomes clear in this phrase of the psalm. "Trouble and anguish have found me out." Once our sin is revealed by the law, Christ reveals himself to us by his Gospel. We are forgiven and the law's accusation ends. The law is a great gift for this main reason (there are many others too). The law shows the truth so that Christ's undeserved mercy and forgiveness are clear. Because it points away from works and to Jesus, we too love the Law of God! Lord Jesus, bless me with the truth, so I may clearly see Your forgiveness again and again. Amen.

## SCRIPTURE: 1 Corinthians 1:4-9 - Jesus' Love is Everything

How could the apostle say that believers are "not lacking in any gift?" If we look to ourselves, we will quickly find that we are lacking in many ways, for we daily sin much. However, the message of God's love for the world does not depend on us, but on Christ. If we have Christ we have all things and we lack no good gift of salvation! It is of the highest importance to recall that it is Christ, not the gifts themselves, that sustain us. Jesus is the one, according to this text, that sustains us to the end, guiltless. *Dearest Jesus, bless us each and every day with Your gifts, and may each gift keep us recognizing at all times that You are the giver and provider of all good things. Amen.*

## SCRIPTURE: Deuteronomy 10:12-21 - Circumcision of the Heart

## SCRIPTURE: John 15:1-17 The Fruit of the Vine through the Branches

The power contained in preaching and teaching and absolution at church is how Jesus (the Vine) works in the Church (the Branches). When we go to church and hear the Gospel and received the Lord's own body and blood, or when we hear the pastor forgive us, we receive through the branches, the fruit of

Christ, the life of the Vine. Lord Jesus, show us Yourself at work through real means of grace. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: 1 John 3:1-8 We are Beloved Children of God

God has made you His very own child. That means you are a part of His family! God Almighty, master of all creation, creator of the universe, ruler of the cosmos has made you a part of His family, a part of Himself in Christ. This means that sin is not our nature, but is only a defeated part of our old nature. For this reason, while we still struggle with sin, we should not obey it or act on it at all. It has been defeated forever. We live in this world where sin still attacks us, but the promise of our Lord is stronger. Forgiveness of sins is ours! God has all authority in heaven and on earth and He says "All your sins are forgiven." Lord God, remind us that although we are undeserving, Your great love for us

keeps us secure in Your family. Thank you for making us Your dear children. In Jesus' name, Amen.
