SCRIPTURE: Matthew 11:12-15 - A Kingdom that can't be Seized

"The kingdom of heaven has suffered violence, and the violent take it by force." The world always fights against the Lord, thinking that the kingdom of heaven is some sort of prize which can be won in a contest of might. But the kingdom of heaven can only be given. It belongs to the Lord and no amount of violence or weapons can pry it from His hands. The kingdom of heaven stands against every assault and every foe, even against the very gates of hell. The kingdom of heaven is built upon the rock that is Christ, Who in His great mercy, gives the kingdom to His precious children, those whom He has purchased by

The world hated them, but that is because the world hates Christ. The world hates all Christians for the same reason. Simon and Jude are no different from us in this respect. We are hated by the world but loved by Christ. Because of that, the world will persecute us, but Christ will redeem and save us. He has called us out of the world, that we would dwell with Him for eternity. The world can do its worst, for, as Luther reminds us, "They only usher us more quickly from this life to Christ in heaven." Lord, thank You for calling me out of the world to be Yours for eternity. SCRIPTURE: John 2:13-17 – A House of Prayer and Forgiveness

Right at the outset of Jesus' ministry, He cleanses the temple of its usury. He will do so again to mark the end of His ministry also. But as we saw with Hezekiah, this is nothing new for the Lord. He is always concerned about His holy house. He desires that it be a place of prayer, a place where the faithful can always offer up petitions for themselves and their neighbors. A place, also, where they can come and receive from the Lord's hand His mercy and kindness. So, moneylending has no place in the Lord's house. It's not a place where forgiveness is purchased with silver or gold. Rather, it is where forgiveness is purchased

with the Lord's own blood and given to all who call upon His name in faith. Lord, thank You for Your continual mercy. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Galatians 2:16-21 - Justified by Faith

Some may try to take the kingdom by violence, others try and force their way in by works. Both ways fail. We cannot gain an inheritance by works. We cannot be justified by our own hands. And if we try, we will fall short. If my righteousness, my good standing before God, comes by my own obedience, then of what value is Christ? That is the problem with those who try and force their way in. They seek to get into the kingdom by a door other than Christ. But Christ, in His death and resurrection, is the only path by which one may be justified. And God be praised for that! For Christ, in His perfection, has done all things well, including the work of justifying you before the Father. Lord, thank You for Your work for me. Amen.

SCRIPTURE: Revelation 14:6, 7 – A Gospel without End
